

Pastor's Page

Here is a question recently brought to pastoral relations.

Q: Has your ministry changed because of the kids?

A: Oh, yes! Totally yes! My ministry has changed significantly.



My ministry has changed in that I am gaining experiences in my call that would not have happened otherwise. An example of this is in a column I wrote that published in the beginning of the year. I shared in the newspaper about being the parent of Baby Jesus. (Craiger had this role in the 2022 Christmas pageant.) You can find this column on my website if you have not yet read it and would like to do so.

My schedule has changed from working daylight hours to working in the wee hours of the morning! I get my God-given thoughts and my writing complete when the house is quiet. It's just quiet at different times now! I have kept my schedule in that I am getting done what needs to be done each week. This includes the occasional funeral or special event.

But yes, my ministry has changed. I am living more life than ever before. Living more life gives me more material and more connections not only to God but also to you, the congregation.

Let me mention Craiger again. Having an almost 9-month old foster child makes me so much more aware of God's love for us. When we went to the Janet Weiss Children's Hospital in Danville following a 2-day stay at EMHS because the Pea Pod had RSV, I learned a lot about being a helpless parent. I learned how prayers come through midnight tears. I learned how help comes from God through amazing caregivers, including you, the congregation.

As I have just shared (and have shared before), I am a foster parent again. My ministry has changed, it's enhanced, because I realize again that as a foster parent "it's never about me or my needs." This is how we are to be as Christians. It is never about us. It is never about our needs. We are to serve. We are to seek God's guidance through prayers. Also, we are to trust God and His outcome, not our own.

Having the kids has not only changed me, but also it has changed you as a congregation. What can be seen is how deeply you care for our Christian Education program, and how you welcome and even embrace children during worship.

Sometimes when I hear the word 'legacy' I first think of how daunting it is! To pass our faith life along to the next generation? Um. Wow. Tall order. Just how do we do that with meaning and intentionality?

We do it one step at a time, one connecting moment at a time.

I want to share a story of the ecumenical Giving Thanks service we had this past November because it speaks to meaning and intentionality, and legacy. The Giving Thanks worship service was held at 6 PM at the Brooklyn Universalist Church. My kids and I hurried through our dinner to make it to this service.

Of course, I didn't do a seating chart for the evening. (Do parents do strategic church seating charts?)

I share this because we walked into the sanctuary and winged it. There was no "She'll sit here," and "He'll sit there." Honestly, you think of these things with the number of kids I have! That did not happen this time. We just felt our way into the sanctuary just as worship began.

My kids don't sit with me in church, of course. With pew buddies, they spread out here in Harford. To an extent, they did it in Brooklyn, too.

One of my angels found a buddy to sit with who is faithful in church attendance here. I'll never forget the sight of my winged little one sitting right next to another angel. The taller angel gently had her arm around my daughter's shoulders. Later, the taller angel told me she did this to keep my daughter still and focused in church, and she was right and good in doing this, but something far, far greater swept over me. What this taller angel did was naturally and beautifully love on the shorter angel. It's a sight I won't forget. It's a memory my daughter won't forget, either.

That's legacy.

So, yes, my ministry has changed. It's changed me. It's changed you, too.



"Your faith has made you well" A memorial tribute to Richie Masters

(This reflection is based off what Pastor Will shared during Richie's service 12/11/22.)

Living words come to us through scripture. Here I remember the Son of God is speaking to a woman with the issue of blood Mark 5:25-34). After she reaches for and touches the hem of Jesus' robe in a very crowded and very pressing public place, the One who heals says to her, "Your faith has made you well."

Her pain had been unbearable both physically and psychologically. She had been an outcast with a forecast of gloom and dismay, but she had what Richie had. We can have this, too. It's the ability to seek and the desire to be made well.

Through the years of following the tremendous gift of his lung transplant, Richie showed all of us his ability to seek and his desire to be made well. So much like the woman I have mentioned, Richie reached for Jesus. He knew great shadows in terms of his health prior to his significant, life-saving surgery. But this didn't stop him. On the contrary, this inspired him not to stay but to move forward, not to settle, but to seek.

It's an audacious move to stand, let alone speak, at a pulpit and go on about wellness when, in fact, the person we remember has died. To preach of being made well when someone we love beyond measure has passed? Who does this?

The one who does this, me, knows Richie well enough to say what is true. His faith did make him well. His faith made him float. I can even say, and I'm not stretching this an iota, his faith made him fly. I say this because Richie wasn't held back. Oh sure, he had days when he hurt physically. His health journey wasn't always bliss, but it was beautiful because as the woman touched Jesus' robe, Jesus touched Richie's soul.

Jesus and Richie had an encounter, an exchange. Amazingly, and that is the word, the two of them didn't have a one time only event. The two experienced an ongoing, interconnected relationship. In this ongoing, interconnected relationship that we, too, can experience, Richie was made well.

Richie knew, and lived, what we can all know and live. It's this. We can all reach out past our barriers, blocks and burdens and touch this gift of heaven here on earth. This gift is called life. And if this scares you, and it might, I have news for you. Remember reach out to Jesus and you will be made well.

We may never know the legacy we leave But do it anyway

"I want to go to church," she had announced that Sunday morning, December 25th. Dressing my mom that morning was an adventure and then a significant challenge for her physically. At one point there in her bedroom after a sudden wave of fatigue and nausea weakened her, she wondered if this would be too much. But she persisted.

That Sunday was the last time my mom and I would ride together. What a blessing, a memory, and a gift. My kids would go with my nieces in the van. My mom and I had her car. Just the two of us.

Getting her into a pew? I will remember those challenges. She landed—and I do mean landed—in the pew that you, the congregation, designated for those with physical limitations or mobility issues. Months ago a pew was taken just in front of the one where she sat. This pew was removed so that even more space to maneuver is available.

I'll share from firsthand experience that "more space" was indeed needed that Christmas morning. That space is needed every Sunday for anyone who may need it.

Mom wasn't well during worship. Her face showed discomfort at times. But she was there.

A legacy my mom leaves is one we can all leave for our loved ones. Be there. In church. Feeling well. Not feeling well. Triumphant. Troubled. Be there.

Four days after Christmas, December 29th, my mom died. We can all persist through our challenges and leave love where we find love, and that's in the sanctuary where God meets us, lifts us, inspires us, and speaks.

My mom's memorial service will be held on Holy Saturday, April 8, at 11:30 AM. A luncheon in the Lecture Hall will follow.




The Gift

To: First Congregational Church Members

We all pray we will never have to face violence, but sometimes it walks through the front door, even in a place where we should feel safe. Mass shootings have become all too familiar today and that is unacceptable. The cadre of instructors at New Milford Rifle and Pistol Club have responded to this by becoming credentialed as instructors for the USCCA Countering the Mass Shoot Threat. We are inviting Church Leaders, Church Security and Parishioners to attend this course.

This class specifically addresses the challenges and potential threats that Houses of Worship face and helps you to learn how to recognize danger and build a security plan while identifying weak points at your facility in order to mitigate overall risk to your congregation.

In this course, you will analyze data gathered from 48 mass shootings that have occurred since columbine to determine what can be learned from these tragedies. You will also be able to identify unique security challenges faced by Houses of Worship and solutions to these challenges that you can readily apply to your own facility.

In so much as New Milford Rifle and Pistol Club is a not-for-profit entity, and due to the vital implications of this training, we will be offering this course for a nominal fee. We can conduct the course at your location or our facility whichever is more convenient for you. Additional, representatives of several Houses of worship could attend the training together.
