
(the following is Pastor's report to Council)

From Our Conference - merging of PNEC and South PA. conferences

1. The Penn Northeast Conference Board of Directors, at the June 8, 2017, meeting appointed the Rev. Dr. Bonnie L. Bates, to the position of Designated-Term Conference Minister, beginning September 1, 2017.

Rev. Bates is currently serving as Associate Association Minister for Congregational Vitality and Development for the Eastern Ohio/Western Reserve Associations of the Ohio Conference, United Church of Christ. Prior to this she served as local church pastor in the New York Conference. Her first career focus was in organizational management and human resource development in non-profit companies.

Rev. Bates earned the Masters of Divinity, and the Doctor of Ministry in Transformative Leadership at Colgate Rochester Crozer Divinity School. She has participated in numerous continuing educational and professional development programs, most notably dealing with COACH training, and Boundary Awareness training.

Rev. Bates comes to us very highly recommended from her references: as a person of deep faith, having great organizational skills, being a wise, prophetic leader, and having a passion and enthusiasm for pastoral leadership, along with a healthy sense of humor, and a great singing voice.

Bonnie is married, the mother of a son, and the grandmother of three.

We look forward to her leadership among us as we discern together where our Still Speaking God is leading us and challenging us to be and to become.

A brief explanation of the position title "Designated-Term." This term indicates the intent of our Board for leadership in the next 3 years which addresses many transformational issues. We needed to appoint a leader for this specific period of time, with this specific responsibility, in addition to all the other duties and responsibilities of being our Conference Minister.

STEWARDSHIP

The June 15th meeting convened at 7:15pm. Present included: Dottir Hagenbuch, Pastor Will, Kay Gow, JoAnn Titus, Lisa Hahn, Craig Stout, Peggy Empet and Evan Clarkson.

The meeting was almost entirely devoted to the Tiffany investments which were bequeathed to the church. JoAnn invited Mr. Leet and Mr. Soden, Certified Financial Planners from Rick Leet Agency to speak with Stewardship Committee concerning how the monies which are currently in mutual funds with Nationwide Insurance might be invested or maximize the return on the investments. The gentlemen gave us an abundance of information (including handouts) and suggestions which gave us "food for thought "not only for the Tiffany investments, but for all of us on a personal level. Mr. Leet inquired as to whether the church had an immediate use or need for the Tiffany money. The stipulation in following the Tiffany's wishes is for the money to be used for a building project, not church improvements or general improvements. Several members questioned if the Tiffany Request could be used to fund a new church sign?

A number of questions were answered by Mt. Leet and Mr. Soden concerning how the money might be invested. Mr. Leet stated if it is to be used within a year, keeping it in the bank was his recommendation.

The first step in the process is to transfer the money from the Tiffany Estate to the church. This will be accomplished with an application and 2 signatures (Dave Schulte and Lisa Hahn) delivered to Rick Leet Agency in New Milford. Rick Leet is to contact Russell Tiffany to ask if his family would approve the use of hisparents gift for the new sign.

June 11th a vote was taken by the church members as to whether we should build a new sign, the design proposed as well as the cost. The vote was a tie and church president Dave Schulte cast a "nay "tie breaker. Because there was not a majority vote, the sign project will be revisited at a later date.

Pastor Will suggested a letter be crafted by Stewardship Committee to be read to the congregation expressing our continued support of one another in the spirit of congregationalism and love. JoAnn with Evan's presence will read it at church on Sunday, June 18. It will also be printed in the Spire.






