

The Christian Message IS hope

I have been a part of a good number of conversations over the past few weeks about how green the lawns are for this time of year. In each individual conversation, I have said, "I can't tell you what lawns should look like at this time of year, but I know this is NOT it!"

Our grass this year is both lush and amazingly rich in color. The amount of rain has been the factor. The sustained mild weather has kept all frost away.

As I look out at this summer-like lawn, the idea of the church's Christmas tree lighting at the end of November keeps coming to mind.

I get it! I get it! Most of us don't want to be thinking about Christmas, especially with our lawns so beautiful and fertile. So many of us long for summer to last longer. For those who don't completely identify themselves as fans of summertime, almost all of us do appreciate the mild weather that autumn brings. Snow means cold. Ice means dangerous roads. Long, dreary nights can be depressing.

This is why I am thinking of the Christmas tree we will be lighting on Sunday, November 28th. The theme this year around the tree is hope. I just texted someone and shared that the Christian message has always been about hope. Christ lights our world. As the newborn... wait, I'll get to that message of light into darkness next month. Now I want to share what has been at the core of every Christian. It is hope. It is hope in tomorrow. It is hope in what will come. It is hope that no matter how cold, how icy, or how depressing life can be, we Christians have hope.

As importantly, we Christians *share* hope. Hope is who we are. Hope is what we do.

No one walks through life without some hurt and hardship. It's what we do with the hurt and hardship that separates the Christian from the world. But it doesn't end there. As a people of hope, we see beyond immediate circumstances. We know our God is with us through our trials and troubles. This knowledge not only changes the situation, but also this knowledge changes us. As we are changed, we naturally advocate or instill change in others.

You're right. October is not the month to be talking about the Christmas tree lighting, at least directly. But lighting others with the light Christ gives us happens all the time. Regardless of the season, we give because we have been given. What we give? That's hope.

At the fall festival this year, I met a young mom whose husband passed away recently. She is now a single mother of a three-year-old. This story is as sad as can be. It's crushing.

But there's hope. There in front of the tub of corn her toddler loved playing in (and the corn was flying!), we talked about God's proximity. She said, "My boy knows where his daddy is."

What the fall festival gives is the opportunity for all of us to not just talk about hope, but live it, lean into it, and share it so obviously that hope is not a theory but an actuality. Love is not just an idea. It's real.

I think about that little boy a lot. He is the age of my youngest. Without hope, I couldn't stand near that boy. With hope, we can all stand and support that boy and his mom and all others who come casually or specifically to this church. Events like the fall festival enable God to be seen, heard, and known to our wider community. I get it. Hope flickers



Christian Education Meeting Minutes

October 25, 2021

Opened in Prayer: Holli

Curriculum: Holli called Davis C. Cook regarding the CDs for each class. Apparently the CDs are no longer included and the music can be accessed via a link. Holli will pass the link to each teacher to download onto a laptop, tablet or phone.

The Winter curriculum has arrived. Holli will keep it until we get closer to the winter quarter. The CD music codes for winter aren't yet available.

Classrooms: The nursery class is bursting at the seams. They have had seven children and need a different type of table. A semi-circle table would be best. They will need one to start and another if the growth continues. We will look into getting a table and extra chairs for this class. (problem solved)

Halloween: Next Sunday is October 31, 2021, Halloween. Some of the children were wanting Halloween crafts. All teachers will be given a pumpkin craft with a Christian poem to accompany it. Each class can decide to use it or not but no other Halloween craft will be done. Karen Jones will help prepare the craft.

Communion: Communion will be discussed one/quarter and additionally if needed. The Children completing second grade (and this year all children through the 4-5-6 class) will receive a special communion in church in the spring. These children will be recognized and a certificate will be given. Each year children completing second grade and those in higher grades that haven't had the special communion will have this special day in the spring.

Bibles: Bibles have not be given to children for some years. All children that have completed the third grade will receive a Bible in church. The Bible has not been selected yet but there was much discussion about selecting a Bible that could be used by children and continued to be used as they mature. Perhaps a teen NIV Bible. Several Bibles will be brought in for further discussion.

Holidays: We will not have Sunday School December 26, 2021 and January 2, 2022. Sunday School will resume January 9, 2022. Flyers will be sent home with the children after Thanksgiving.

Christmas: Christian Education is planning a Christmas Pageant. We are hoping to have a Youth Sunday December 19, 2021 and include all children and youth in the telling of the birth of Jesus Christ. We will begin practicing during Sunday School time December 5 and 12, 2021. We will have refreshments after the service on December 19, 2021.

Next meeting will be after Christmas as needed.

Teen time and talk. Christian Education for Junior/ Senior High students

They come each Sunday morning. And I don't know about you, but waking a teen in the morning? Yep. That is mission impossible.



But they do come. The teen Sunday school class that meets in my office faithfully learns about the scripture that will be presented later in church. We discuss the text through the lenses the teens experience in their lives today. These conversations are real and honest, touching and inspiring.

This class is also learning things that a confirmation class covers. Recent discussion includes Christology (who is Christ and what is Christ?), communion, and what it means to be a part of a body of believers. For example, when we say, "I'm a Christian," what does that mean?

We answer this.

Each student will be invited to join the church as a member in the spring of this year. Some will say yes. Others may say, "Not yet." If this isn't the time for the student to join in full membership, this same opportunity will happen in the spring of 2023 and every year thereafter—unless we change who and how we are to do God's work among our teens.

I'll share that the round table in my office has been completely full more times than not. They are coming. What excites us as a group is how the scripture is real, applicable, and relevant.

In addition to all of our CE programming, teachers and students, please hold these teens in your prayers. Thank you.

Visitation: Why Deacons? Communion should be given in community.

Deacons are responsible for the care of the congregation Visitation is made more comfortable in teams

With the change from Christian Education of moving the Confirmation Class to the Sunday School time frame of 9:00-9:45, the early afternoon is now available (11:30-1:30). Judy Mitchell will arrange the visits for 15 minutes with 15 minutes transportation time between visits. If a person needs additional time with Will, he will schedule that visit alone.

Each person visited will be asked if they would like Communion and it will be given using the travel communion set and written liturgy. After introductions and brief conversation, the person will be asked if they would prefer time alone with Will and if they do, the Deacon will wait in the car. If not, they will continue to visit.

Four visits will be planned per Sunday with Deacons rotating days on a schedule. If a person requests an alternate day and time, those Deacons that are unable to visit Sunday can be rotated in to the schedule based on their availability.

Communion: The UCC has an "Open Table" policy. That means all who come to the Table are welcome to partake of the elements. Children are also welcome at the table with the parent's permission and hopefully their instruction as to what is happening.

The Christian Education Committee is striving to education our children about the sacrament of Communion and Pastor Will is planning to continue to add his instruction periodically at the opening of Sunday School.

The specifics of children and Communion are being passed to the Christian Education Committee for discussion and implementation. It is hoped that our CE committee can implement a milestone program for our children's growth and understanding of Communion, the Bible and their faith. A spring date for the Communion milestone will be suggested.

All Saints Day: The day is set for October 31, 2021. Judy will send out an E-prayer message asking for the names of those we will mention during the service and a picture to accompany the name if desired.

New Members Class: the new member class went very well with the changes implemented (co-teaching, visitors from different groups in the congregation, lunch). Areas for improvement: specific discussion about Communion in the UCC, Baptism in the UCC.

The next New Member Class will begin March 6 and end April 3 with joining date of Palm Sunday

Bibles: Children have not received personal Bibles for quite a few years. Deacons will partner with the CE committee to purchase Bibles for all children finishing 3rd grade and up through the 12th grade. The Christian Education committee will be asked if they would like to select the Bibles to be given. An end of Sunday School date will be suggested.


Meeting the Spirit — Bible Study




