SHOULD WE PRAY TO GOD WHEN ANGRY? Y E S!

Dear Congregation,

Here in the office this morning, I opened an email from Steve Brown at Key Life Connection. The email is titled, "The Problem with Prayer."

Steve's honesty strikes me. His candor impresses me. His relationship with God inspires me because, like Steve, there are times God gets an "ear full" from me.

Do you ever give God your heartbreak, your angst, and your anxiety? I hope you do. This is why God is here for us.

"Pretty prayers" are just that—pretty. In prayer, all we need to let God hear what hurts.

This is a part of what Steve shares (below).

Hey guys,

I told God today what he did wrong yesterday.

You what?

Yeah, sometimes I grade God. Sometimes I cuss, spit, rant and complain.

You're probably not saved! I always had my doubts.

Actually, I am saved and that's the reason I pray the way I do. I don't wear masks. In fact, prayer is about the only place where I can be honest, say what I think, and know I won't be kicked out. I don't tell God I love him when I don't, nor do I use religious phrases that aren't true. (It really isn't a good thing to lie to God because he knows exactly what we're thinking.) If it weren't for that honest time with my Father each morning, I'm not sure I would survive.

Let me tell you about prayer and why it's such a pain for many of us. You don't fool me. I've been doing this for a long time. I know me and I know people. We use spiritual words ("quiet time," "devotion," etc.) to mask the reality that we would rather do something religious to ameliorate our guilt than pray.

Most of us don't like praying because:

- 1) We've listened to "testimonies" from others about prayer (they're generally lying, but you don't know that) and there is no way their experience comes close to matching our own.
- 2) We're really busy doing God's work and don't have time to pray.
- 3) We really don't believe that it does any good.
- 4) Frankly, we're not sure that God will show, and it's better to hope that he's around than to check and find out that it was all a fantasy and then have nothing.

Steve is more cynical than I am. He might say he's a bit jaded when it comes to how he sees those who are religious.

In his message here, Steve says most of us don't like praying. I disagree. I know some of you pray all the time. Literally. All the time. There may be a few 'amens' sprinkled throughout your day, but you're constantly in chatter with God. You are continually in communion with Him.

This is not all of us, but all of us can aspire to Paul who calls us to pray ceaselessly (1 Thessalonians 5:17). I share this because if or when you hurt in that deep, raw, angry, bitter way, vent to God. Gripe to God. Grumble to God. Growl to God.

And cry to God, or cry out to God. The real prayer. *YOUR* prayer. The you-to-God prayer. The one prayer God knows you have is the one prayer God wants you to share with Him.

If we keep God in a pristine box where on perfectly polished white marble floors He presides, He isn't assessable to us when we are slobbery, dirt-stained hot messes. Pray to God always. Even when—or especially when—you're upset or angry, He will hear You and help You.

Deacons will continue to fill out this outline over the next two months. Representatives from Stewardship, Deacons, Trustees, Missionary, Council and others will be asked to co-teach one class with Pastor.

Deacons will seek mentors for each new member and record classes for that have to miss a class.

Youth New Member Class: This class will be for 9-12th graders. The class will be based on the structure of the adult class but will include more about developing a relationship with God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit. Those interested will be questioned as to their availability for days and times. This class will begin after the end of the adult class (October 10) and be led by the pastor. More to come.

Confirmation class: This class will be offered to Junior High Students in the spring of 2022. Deacons will continue to work on the structure and content of this class over the summer.

Fellowship Time: Linda Lindsey suggested that we reinstate our time of gathering and fellowship. The COVID restrictions will be lifted after June 28. We will form a committee of people that would like to host or get others to host the fellowship time just prior to worship.

We will offer coffee (regular and decaf), tea, and juice as beverages. We will also offer cookies or the like and a healthier alternative. We will set up taller tables with a small centerpiece in the gathering room to set down cups for conversation. If desired the refreshments can be taken into worship. Any spills will be cleaned -up and treated.

Reminder: People matter more than objects. We can have a pristine, empty sanctuary or a sanctuary that invites people in and encourages interaction. We plan to use the Outreach funds for this endeavor.

We plan to have a table set up with cards for signing for those that are home-bound, ill, have experienced loss or just need a pick-me-up.

We also plan to have a screen displaying a loop of current events that may be of interest to those in attendance or those visiting our church.

Bible Study: We will discuss in-person and Zoom Bible study at the next meeting as we ran out of time.

Baptism: There are three baptisms planned in the near future. A rose with vase will be given after the service to the family of the baptized. A deacon will assist with each baptism.

Teresa Lamberson will be the Council Representative in June.

Finance committee—did not meet as a result of vacations. A finance committee meeting is to be set up before the next council meeting. This committee includes the following people: Nancy Burris, Connie Breese, Holli Chichester, Julia Gardner, David Schulte, and Maureen Warren. This meeting is to decide what to do with the growth from the Julia Hudson house of \$9,000 and the Tingley Lake property sale money. The minimum amount that can be invested with Nancy Burris' business is \$10,000. If the committee feels that the decision is an emergency of where to invest the money then an emergency council meeting will be called for after service before the next council meeting. If it is not felt to be a dire emergency then at the next council meeting we will vote on their proposition.

Stewardship Minutes - 6-17-2021

Present were Peg Empet, Ellen Holdredge, Nancy Burris, Michelle Estabrook, Will Hagenbuch and Kay Gow.

Under old business we discussed how much money from the sale of the Tingley Lake property and Julia Hudson Fund the church wanted to invest in an annuity similar to the one we currently have. Nancy said all she needs to know is how much and she can do the paperwork. The minimum is \$10,000 that can be invested. Peg is going to talk to David Schulte to get his input and then let Nancy know by email and she will begin the paperwork.

The memorial fund donations as written in last month's minutes are to be used for things which enhance worship services or add to the sanctuary.

Youth and Outreach have been separated into two areas. Youth was given \$3,000 and Outreach was given the remaining \$5,823.03. We hope this clears up any confusion that has been in the past.

Under the topic of a "Care Network" to connect with the congregation and community; Michelle mentioned Peg Smith had spoken with her and said the HVA is currently at full capacity and it might be nice to have a representative from Stewardship go to the HVA and see what the residents might need (Ex: Grocery shopping, rides to Dr's appt's and any other things they would require). We decided to have an Ice Cream Social on July 16th or 17th with the Susquehanna County Dairy Program providing the ice cream and have a Dairy Princess or Maid serve the ice cream. The final date and time will be set at the next meeting. A flyer will be made up and placed in the HVA to let the residents know about this event.

We also discussed getting other groups involved in doing things at the HVA. Ideas for this were Game-On, Choir, and Ugly Quilts. Also, we were thinking of having a game day where we would play games such as; bingo or perhaps putting puzzles together. Another idea was having a picnic or a reading. At the times we as Stewardship Committee have an event at the HVA it was suggested we might pass out a note card with the times church services are held.

A date of 13 March 2022 was set for a Commemoration Service to remember whose we loved and lost during the COVID pandemic.

Under new business Peg said Shirley had mentioned perhaps having a Bereavement Group where Barton-Myer Funeral Home would come and talk to those who have lost someone and help them deal with all they are feeling.

There will be no meeting in August, but our next meeting is 15 July @ 6:30.

If one is uncomfortable with this service being on YouTube please notify the pastor or office and the camera will be directed elsewhere.

Betty Lou suggested for Will to look at the camera to ask for anyone not present to come join in worship.

David mentioned that a few are carrying much by those not being present.

Michelle suggested a little script to run beforehand mentioning church information.

Betty Lou thought that a third screen hung on the balcony would be helpful for Will to look at and not have to turn around to look at the screen behind him. Betty Lou said that she is willing to pay for a third screen.

Will continues to ask for repeated feedback on the worship services.

Judy asked about returning to passing the offering plates. We are no longer wearing masks so no one is worried and we could resume passing the offering plate. Deacons will discuss this matter at their next meeting.


