Reaching Up to God, Reaching Out to People



Easter is never over

Here we are, two weeks or so after Easter. The lily in the living room window is beginning to fade. Those once beautiful "white trumpet flowers" are completely gone. What is left over that still festive purple foil paper is all green now. Sadly, some of those green leaves are fading to yellow.

Now what?

Well, turn to scripture. We're not the first to experience post-Easter doldrums. In John 21, Peter announces to the others, "I'm going fishing." Some take this to mean that he is going back to fishing. He is returning to his old way of life. To this, the others respond, "We are also coming with you (John 21:3)."

So, it's a valid question: After Easter, then what?

To get at the answer, consider John 1. John wrote this chapter in the Bible around 100 A.D.. Written from Ephesus, this pastoral letter encourages and instructs the congregations in that area of Asia Minor, seven of which are mentioned in the Book of Revelation. William Barclay explains John 1 like this:

"Many (of John's readers) were now second or even third generation Christians. The thrill of the first days had, to some extent, at least, passed away. ... In the first days of Christianity there was a glory and a splendor, but now Christianity had become a thing of habit, 'traditional, half-hearted, nominal." ... John was writing at a time when, for some at least, the first thrill was gone and the flame of devotion had died to a flicker." (*The Letters of John and Jude*, Daily Bible Study Series, p. 3).

Our early Christians were plagued with two pressing issues. The first was lethargy. Their lack of energy and enthusiasm lingered because the followers lost sight of their distinctiveness as disciples of Jesus Christ. In other words, they experienced what some of us may experience. They blended in with the world around them.

They also experienced heresy (false teachings). These came about as a result of competing ideologies where eager souls were ungrounded. Good intentioned speakers were eager to put their particular spin on the gospel message. This was not an intentional sidestep. Remember, they didn't have biblical commentaries, or even hundreds of years of Christian practice. They spoke in pocket communities, too. These enthusiasts were finding their way in a world unfamiliar with—and certainly unwelcoming of—Christianity.

Do not despair. Easter isn't over. Remember what I said about Peter returning to fishing? Well, guess who shows up on shore? You're right when you said, "Jesus."

Jesus meets us. Easter is never over.

So, what's our application? How do we move past the Easter Sunday sensation? The big thrill of planning for and attending Easter in church? Go fishing. This fishing doesn't need a pole, net or boat necessarily. Be looking for things that reveal the fingerprint of God. Specifically, consider things that are similar to what you have seen God's Son do in the past.

One great way to do this is to familiarize yourself with the people of Scripture (or revisit Scripture). Read those stories you learned in VBS and Sunday School as a child. They will make more sense now because you will see how God moved in the lives of those on the pages. Another helpful exercise is to learn or recall the promises God has made. One of the promises God makes is that of His continuing presence.

Okay, the Easter lily is fading, but Easter? Easter is never over! If you are experiencing a hard time or a lack of Spirit as we move further into the month of May, remember Jesus' teachings. Consider what he said, especially in his prophetic messages. Look for signs that He is there with you, working, moving, and completing His plan in your life. Just like those disciples who knew Jesus best, you may be missing Him standing right there on your shore. Jesus isn't gone because Easter isn't over. Look around. He is calling you, seeking you, speaking to and reminding you of who, exactly, He is (and who, exactly, you can be with Him).

Pastor's Page

I have a few questions for you.

-What kind of empowering station are you when it comes to encouraging others?

-Is Harford First Congregational-UCC a place where people feel the power of Jesus Christ?

-When our community goes without power again, should there be something we do about this? Can we be more present to those in need? If so, what does this look like?

Witnessing wobbles? Forget those times you think you can't share how God is or who God is. Speak with someone about a time you didn't have it together (in other words, share when you were powerless) and God did what God does—He pulled you through.

Powerless/Powerful

Feels good to have the power back on, doesn't it? Your elation may be different than the one I'm about to share, but this scene in front of our family refrigerator may help you remember the joy you experienced when power returned after the April 19th heavyweight snowstorm wreaked mayhem across the county.

"Hey, guys!" My nine-year-old cheered. "The light in the refrigerator is on! And the milk! It's *cold!* It's really, really cold!"

Many things can be said about the widespread, long-lasting power outage, but first let's thank the crews who tirelessly worked to restore what we all wanted—power. It's true. We want power.

Our want for power (and comfort) is an underlying theme in both the gospel reading and the epistle lesson for this past Sunday, April 24th. Both John 20 and Acts 5 speak to our human nature of wanting to call the shots and having it our way. In John 20, the disciple Thomas wants to see—and understand—the risen Christ on his terms with his criteria. He seeks power on his terms.

In Acts 5, the apostles have been commissioned to share the Good News of the gospel of Jesus Christ yet meet opposition. The power problem they experience is one where they don't have any! They are at the whim of the religious powermongers of the day. These religious leaders have thrown Jesus' elite into a public jail because these upstart, marginalized preachers and their liberating messages of eternal life through the Son of God are not kosher with The Establishment.

These are parallel stories of the have-nots in the face of the haves. We can relate. We did not have power. We wanted power. Specifically, we wanted power back.

A strong Easter message rises here. As we move further into this new Christian season of Spring and a redeemed life made available to us not by our power but Jesus', let's be reminded of what Thomas and his peers experienced—the risen Christ among them. These once frightened and now faithful followers didn't just *experience* their leader and friend who had moved from death-to-life out of his love for them; they shared his death-to-life love not to some but to all of us. Think about it. Their ministry directly impacts our ministry moments today.

We can experience Jesus' power today when we realize this humble truth: we don't have power. Everything we do—everything we say—isn't our doing. It isn't our power. It's Christ's.

Pastor's Page Continued:

A great story illustrates this. A remarkable Christian Education director was stymied. She was really stuck. Had her back been up against a wall she might have considered that a good thing. (At least it would have held her up.) But she didn't even have a wall.

She came to me with a low, quiet voice, a voice that revealed to both of us that she knew who she was. With a voice of half resignation and half frustration, she said what we all need to hear. "I don't have it. This has to all be God." You likely know how the next page in this story goes. God did have it. And God took it. And God ran with it. And it was good.

Power outages? Yes, hello, we want to be comfortable. When sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ, we also want to experience more success and far less strain. I get it. We all get it! But let's get what Jesus is saying when we don't have power. In my heart (and perhaps in yours, too), you have heard Jesus share these words. "I have you. I have this. Don't trust yourself. Trust me."

Cold milk in a refrigerator is a good thing. Having a Savior with all the power? Well, now, that's a bazillion times better, isn't it?

EASTER LILY DISTRIBUTION: Many of the lilies that filled the cross (pictured) were given to the church. They were not supposed to stay in the sanctuary beyond our Easter Sunday service. They were to be given away, and that's exactly what happened.

15 lilies went to the Harford Village Apartments (the HVA). HVA resident, Alice Archer, was helpful here because the lilies were given to those who were home over the Easter Holiday. What a gift to have a flower and a reminder of who Jesus is! That tomb IS empty!

My kids and I packed our van twice and went through Harford with a list of those who, for one reason or another, needed an Easter reminder at home. As kids love candy, it turns out kids also like to give flowers away. I mean, they REALLY like to give flowers away! My

guys and girls actually jockeyed to see who could go to the next house. Throughout the whole ride, which took almost two hours, I'd hear from the driver's seat, "My turn! My turn!"

Not only were the recipients blessed, but also my kids were, too. Together, let's continue to see what our "Outreach Ministry" can do not only for all our children involved in Sunday school, but also for those who receive our outreach. We have a direct way of witnessing God's love to a world that needs just that—God's love.

Handing flowers or goodies to people—or leaving them at their doorstep—is a beautiful and specifically local ministry. The flowers the church gave away not just on Christmas Day (with the poinsettias) but also at Valentine's Day, with the lovely Anonymously donated flowers, and the Goody bag distribution this year. Everyone who delivered flowers or Goody Bags experienced what is so true: it is SUCH an AMAZING feeling to share God's love in a literal, tangible way. To see a face light up with a smile when flowers or goodies are handed over is heartwarming and special.

As pastor of this church, I want to thank our flower donors this year, both at Christmas time and here at Easter. Your thoughtfulness and Christian love does make a difference!



Conflict in Ukraine

Samaritan's Purse meeting Urgent Needs, Working Alongside Church Partners.

The world is shocked and horrified by the images of death and destruction coming out of Ukraine, a catastrophe we have not witnessed in Europe since the Second World War.

"Ukrainian families are hurting and in desperate need of prayer and support as millions flee for their lives,"



said Franklin Graham. "We want to meet the needs of these families in their darkest moments while pointing them to the light and hope of Jesus Christ."

In addition to our medical work, Samaritan's Purse is providing hundreds of tons of food, as well as water, hygiene kits, blankets, winter clothing, and other important items to refugee families. We are working alongside local churches to get this urgent relief to those in greatest need.

We've also sent thousands of children's backpacks to Ukraine aboard our DC-8 aircraft. Included inside are a soft bear that says "God Loves You" in their language on the front, plus crayons, a sketch pad, a knit hat, a ball, and a booklet in Ukrainian that tells them God loves them.

Samaritan's Purse has a partner network of more than 3,000 churches in Ukraine and neighboring Moldova. As conflict erupted, we were in the process of distributing 600,000 Operation Christmas Child gift-filled shoeboxes in Ukraine.

Financial Secretary and Treasurer's report were reviewed and accepted.


