Let the breeze blow:

New windows will help us see our dear, rich past

The hailstorm that significantly damaged our church will go down as a vivid memory in our history books.

I hope the following part in the story is forgotten though. I have received several people offering sympathy. "I'm sorry this has happened to the church," they've written.

I am not sorry. This storm, which came as we prepare for Pentecost, perfectly demonstrates God's power by way of the Holy Spirit in that windstorm. Our responsiveness to the storm also demonstrates perfectly who we are as God's people. We jumped in. We dealt with a hurdle, not a hardship. Busy Trustees were on sight as soon as they could literally get there and problem-solved beautifully. Our next door neighbor, Dustin Walker, and his stepson Colton did what neighbors do—they loved us by helping us immediately cover our fractured windows with much-needed heavy plastic.

Tragedy can bring out the best—or the worst—in us. This was not a tragedy; it could have been *far worse*; but I'm clear on this: this storm brought out the community mindfulness this congregation has for its beautiful, historic church and its lifelong success.

Of course, I understand why people said they were sorry we had such damage done. Such kindness is always appreciated.

But God sent us a message. When those new windows arrive, we will be able to see the world in a new way, a way in which God intends.

This "new" way is actually as old as scripture itself because it reminds us that God provides for His people. While no one *likes* to spend money, the expense of new windows came somewhat easily because this church membership tithes. We listen to what God asks of us. The "rainy day" monies were in place for that rainy day because we know our scripture, and tithing is our dedication to our endlessly dedicated God.

Just as quickly as you rallied to get peanut butter in for the Summer Lunch Box program (and we easily reached our goal early this year), the hailstorm was our reminder of who we are when we work as one. You are a *united* United Church of Christ, and I am so blessed to be working with you. But that's just a happy pastor talking. The One to listen to is God. He is challenging us by calling us forward to be the place all can go when storm winds blow.

Yes, new windows will help us see our dear, rich past—and our future—with our God of love.

Treasurer's Report given by Julie Gardner. Summer lunch box money was sent in May and money in Sunday School improvements was moved to Youth & Outreach Activities. Reserve money is being moved to an account that gives a better interest rate.

Christian Education reported by Kay Gow. The Sunday School will be continuing with the Bible in a Year curriculum for next year, there will be a sleep- over in the summer, Animal Resource Center (ARC) was discussed as a project in conjunction with the Girl Scouts, Game On, and church with more to come later.

Choir reported by Ellen Holdredge. Choir is done with Tuesday night practices until September. Last Sunday to sing is May 27.

Church Cupboard-reported by Maureen Warren. Serving 3 families and 5 individuals.

Clerk-no report.

Cradle Roll- Holli Chichester reported no activity this month.

Deacons- Kay Gow reported they would like patriotic songs for Memorial Day Sunday. Dave would like us to use the new words for army song (sung to tune of Cassons Rolling Along). They will be asking for father pictures for Father's Day. Plans are being made for next year.

Game On—Reported by Craig Stout. Game On is on vacation except for a few things that may happen in the summer.

Historian-no report

Missionaries- Holli Chichester reported that Anne Thompson will talk about the problems in Nicaragua and about the work of the Missionaries we support on May 22 at 1PM. Everyone is invited. \$305 was raised at the bake sale. They are collecting for the yard sale in June.

Nominating-Jacquie Phillips reported that there was no activity this month.

Stewardship- Craig Stout reported that they didn't have a quorum to conduct business.

Trustees- Harry Gardner reported that they are investigating repairing the front doors. Kay will try to shampoo the hall carpet and if that doesn't work, then we'll try a professional. The steeple needs attention and Gary will contact Hudak after the adjuster has been there to get a quote on cleaning or Mike Bailey is a possibility if we rented the lift. The wrap on the front porch of Lecture Hall needs attention so they may put a vinyl sleeve over it.

Hail Damage. Harry had not had a call from any insurance people and was encouraged to call again. On day of storm, Dustin Walker next door furnished plastic for covering the windows. His stepson Colton helped with covering. Harry was asked to have Kavetski give him an estimate on the Lecture Hall window replacements on broken windows. Warning signs have been put up in and around buildings asking people to stay out. We have no idea what will need to be done or how long it will take. Most building usage plans are being put on hold or moved to another venue until we have concrete news.

Willing Workers-reported by Ellen Holdredge. Thank you notes were sent to roaster oven donators and people who allowed Memorial Fund money to be used to help purchase new stove. Stove cost \$8189, minus \$6573 from Memorial fund so Willing Workers paid \$1616. The Fair was discussed. Kandy is in charge of log cabin, ad for fair book (advertising log cabin and chicken and biscuit dinner in dining hall) and rent for log cabin were paid for. Cookie making and fudge dates were set. Roast beef dinner will be Nov 17 with JoAnn's help. Kitchen storage is an on going issue. Hauling coffee pots and roasters up from cellar is more and more difficult for our members. Because of this, the Willing Workers would like permission to have cupboards installed under the counter top in the gathering room with Willing Workers to assume the cost. Motion Passed.

Pastor's report by Pastor Will Hagenbuch—Will be helping Dave Schulte record his first vlog to share info on his upcoming Memorial Day weekend sermon. Will received \$2,000 scholarship from Penn Northeast Conference to help with semester's tuition. Intensive week at Lancaster Seminary is May 20 –May 26. Courses are America's Changing Landscape and Spirituality in the 21st Century.

Met with Girl Scouts and announced on May 6 that church and Girl Scouts will work together to begin ARC (Animal Resource Center). Specifics later.

Met with Trustees to talk about possibility of leveling an area behind the church parking lot for a safe place for older kids to play during Game On.

Met with Brandy Lindsey and Dave Gebo twice to prepare for upcoming wedding at church on June 15.

Have made "house calls" and appreciate suggestions of those who need visits.

A Community Group has been formed of Pastor Will, Boy & Girl Scout leaders, fire company, church, little league, and farmers for Harford and surrounding communities to develop resources that can be used by all members of the community. A Community Day event is planned for September 15 with place to be announced. Church groups will be encouraged to participate. The group will meet again on June 5.

OLD BUSINESS

Matt Mitchell will set up a web site. We have a "drop box" so Holli Chichester can put church stuff in and Matt can access it. Matt does not do streaming but the person who does web site does not have to do streaming. We don't have the right equipment to make streaming work as it should. Jim Fluck was contacted but he only does audio not video. There was lots of discussion. We think we need 1 camera with direct streaming and internet capabilities. Dave suggested Matt Georgetti the Mt. View IT guy. Dave will get in contact with him and get his phone number for Holli.

NEW BUSINESS

Due to storm damage, another place to meet is needed until the church is safe. The Baptist church is Clifford said we were welcome to meet there at 11:30. Craig had talked to fire company and we may use their room in the AM on Sunday but will need to set up and put away as they have an afternoon function. There will be no Sunday School. Dear friends of the CHE Association Nicaragua,

Blessings to all of you, and heartfelt thanks for the support many of you have offered over the years. This is the first time that Bill and I have sent an appeal letter. We hope that, when you read it, you will understand why we felt that we should send it.

As some of you know, civil unrest, riots (about 50 people, mostly students, have been killed by police), anti-government demonstrations, roadblocks, and robberies in markets and supermarkets have been going on for about a month now in Nicaragua. There is no sign that this will end soon. Ordinary Nicaraguans, including those whom some of us know and love, are finding it very difficult to live their daily lives. In addition, taxis and buses are either on strike at times, or cannot get through due to roadblocks, so many people cannot get to work. A large number of people are staying locked in their houses.

The central CHE training team has suspended their trips to the communities until further notice after a trip last week where a, typically, 6 hour journey required an overnight stay, a 9 hour wait in the heat of the highway at a roadblock, and a 30 mile detour. The minibus door was damaged slightly by people beating on it during the road block, and the back of the van was damaged when it got stuck in a river on the detour. They just managed to leave the city at the end of the detour before barricades with flaming tires were put in place.

One community with great needs is the group of tiny islands south of Juigalpa: they have fish, but other than some milk, and a little bit of gardening, do not produce anything else to eat. Their nearest town for provisions and doctor visits is 1 1/2 hours away, and that is where Darling and the team had to spend the night because of the blockades and unrest.

The CHE team implores you to pray:

that God would give strength to the CHE leaders in the communities - people who, themselves, are afraid and desperately worried about being able to obtain food - so that these leaders may show the love, hope, and light of Christ in their communities; that God bring a just peace to Nicaragua. And to thank God that denominational differences have been laid aside, and the churches have drawn together to help the vulnerable and those in danger, comfort the bereaved, and strive for peace. May the Holy Spirit guide all their interactions.

Would you consider being part of 'the team that provides and prays'? Thank you for praying - that is the most powerful help we can give. In addition, if you are able, would you contribute to the purchases of the basic necessities of life in Nicaragua: rice, beans, cooking oil, sugar, medicines, gasoline, and diesel? God will find a way for the CHE leaders to get these items to those who need them. No donation is too small. This request is urgent because there are already shortages. People need to buy now, so that they can have food saved while there is still food in the supermarkets.

I am not praying for the world but for those whom you have given me, for they are yours. 10 All mine are yours, and yours are mine, and I am glorified in them. 11 And I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, keep them in your name, which you have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one. 12 While I was with them, I kept them in your name, which you have given me. I have guarded them, and not one of them has been lost except the son of destruction, that the Scripture might be fulfilled. 13 But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves. 14 I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. 15 I do not ask that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one.[a] 16 They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. 17 Sanctify them[b] in the truth; your word is truth. 18 As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. 19 And for their sake I consecrate myself,[c] that they also may be sanctified[d] in truth.
