

To make expenses every month in the general (example: electric, payroll, office and programs), we will need \$12,895.83 a month to meet our Budget for 2021.

This is the financial scene that started off our September 2021 Council meeting. \$9,741.36 in the red and no money available to pay our bills.

Your Council had to make some very difficult and disappointing decisions so that our bills could be paid.

\$2000 was taken from the Sign maintenance fund leaving only \$845.50

\$2022.79 was taken from the Other (used for special projects) leaving none

\$80.48 was taken from the copier category leaving none

\$5000 was taken from Technical Support leaving \$534.26

\$1206.35 was taken from the Nicaragua Fund (Kay Gow and Holli Chichester had set aside personal funds for

a future mission trip) leaving none.

Total : \$10,309.62

The bills have been covered for this month, but what about next month and the next? All our work to reach out to the community and grow our children's programs will be halted if we are unable to turn on the lights or the heat.

Our church, our community is led by Jesus.... to be more, to do more. God's work does have a cost and we all need to be aware that we are not currently able to pay it. Please consider your giving this month and what we can do when we are fully funded.

GOD IS TALKING TO US

Adrian Rogers once said, "It's what you sow that multiplies, not what you keep in the barn." What are we keeping? Perhaps for some of us we're keeping a God that is too small. A God that is okay with how things are. A God who doesn't ask much, or expect much. This is not the God I know. This is not the God you know, either. The God I know challenges us. The God I know changes us. The God I know creates for us opportunities to witness to Him not just with our lips, but our wallets.

I share Rogers' quote not only because it's true, but also because it needs to be said now. We are at a pivotal time in our church history. A time for giving financially to the General Fund is now. Financially, we are where we have been before. This is not new. What IS new at this time is the opportunity we have to pray for God to lead us through this season as He has led us through financially challenging situations in the past.

I've been in leadership long enough to understand when God is talking. Don't get me wrong, God's silences are good, too. But when the Great "I AM" has something to say, it comes through unavoidably. God is talking to us now. He's not saying, "Small." He's not saying, "Cut back." He's saying, "Give—and I'll show you yet again how much more I'll give back to you." Like me, you only know a big, bold God who does big, bold things to those He loves. Look. Listen. Pray. Respond. Our financial future rests with you. More specifically, it moves with you. It's time for us to see again how God will part a sea, make a way, and get us through this.

Letter to Parents of 7th-12th grade Students

Hi parents, the Christian Education Committee has reassessed our youth program for 2021-2022. We originally planned to have a Youth Membership Class for 5 weeks for 9-12th graders and a Confirmation Class for 7-8 graders starting after Christmas.

As we prayed over these decisions and worked to set up the curriculum, we began to feel concerned that we were not giving our youth the connection and support that they need to establish their own faith base. It was felt that our youth have lost their connection to the church during COVID and that more consistent meeting would be the best solution.

We decided to combine the two classes (Youth Membership Class and Confirmation Class) to offer our Youth a more in-depth opportunity to share their faith and their concerns. Starting September 12, 2021, Harford First Congregational Church began our Youth Sunday Meeting at 9:00 - 9:45 for 7th-12th graders. We will meet every Sunday and will cover topics of interest to our youth along with the topics normally covered during a Confirmation Class. Pastor Will is teaching this class and will have others Co-teaching with him on occasion to add other perspectives and broaden the support of our congregation.

In the spring, any of the youth that wish to join the church will be encouraged to do so. If a youth does not feel ready, they will have the opportunity to do so when they feel ready. The Youth Sunday Meeting Class will continue through each school year. Youth will be encouraged to continue attending for spiritual support and fellowship, whether they join the church or not.

Pastor Will plans use several resources in guiding this class: Words for the Journey (Letters to our Teenagers about Life and Faith), My Confirmation (A Guide for Confirmation Instruction) and the Bible.

Our Youth are precious to us and we are striving to offer them the best possible support and guidance as they begin the process of becoming adults and establishing their own relationship with God the Father, Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit.

Deacon Minutes - 9-20-2021

Attending: Ginny Ahearn, Kathryn Doolittle, Will Hagenbuch, Holli Chichester, Tammy Stout, Teresa Lamberson via Zoom

Fellowship Time: The Fellowship time Sunday mornings from 9:30-10:00 seems to be going nicely. Linda Lindsey put up a sign-up sheet for hosts for the Fellowship time and people signed up through the time she is in Florida. It was mentioned that some of the children requested Hot Chocolate. Children under 4th grade will receive water for their beverage.

Prayer List: Our prayer list has gotten very long and some of these persons' well-fare unknown. It has been our practice to remove names after 2-3 weeks but it is felt that contacting each person for an update on their prayer concern would be a better solution. It would give the church more information for prayers and let the individual know that we care. We will look for one or more persons that could take this as their ministry of care. Judy Mitchell has volunteered to work with this ministry but needs another person to make calls.

Visitation: The Deacons wish to begin visiting our congregation again with Pastor Will. We have made a tentative list of people to visit. All persons will be contacted to set the date and time prior to the visit (target days are Thursday or Friday between the hours of 10 and 2). Communion will be offered. If the person/ persons visited wish to have private time with Pastor Will, the Deacon will retire to the car. Visits will be held to 15 minutes. If more time is desired, Pastor Will can set a return visit. Most of these visits will happen during the day. Tammy, Ginny and Holli are willing to visit. Linda, Missy, LeeAnn and Lisa will be asked if they can visit.

World Wide Communion Sunday: October 3, 2021. Pastor Will is considering the sermon for this day. The service will be all about communion. Kathryn will help distribute the Elements at one door we will need one more deacon for the other door. Holli will check to be sure that we have enough communion supplies. We will have people pick up the elements as they enter the sanctuary.

Children's Ministry- Communion: Deacons will work with the Sunday School Teachers in Communion Education through out this year. The children in 2nd grade and above will receive recognition in church in the spring and receive their communion, a certificate and a small celebration. Thereafter, children will receive communion in the spring of their 2nd grade year, a certificate and a celebration. No child will be denied communion but a milestone event will occur each year for our children.

Children's Ministry – Bibles: All children will be instructed on the Bible (what it is, who wrote it, how to use it) in Sunday School. This year all children finishing the 3^{rd} grade and above will be recognized by the Deacons and will receive a Bible in church. During the following years, on the completion of the 3^{rd} grade, the Deacons will recognize each these children and gift them with a Bible.

Grief Seminar: There is a Conference seminar on Grief, November 6, 2021 in Allentown. It was suggested that it might be easier to attend a seminar closer to Harford. Teresa shared that she attended a Grief seminar held at Bartron-Myer Funeral home and lead by Dale and Sandy Black. Holli will contact Bartron-Myer Funeral Home for more information. Harford Church could host the seminar at our church. This will be discussed at the next Deacon meeting.

Christmas Tree Lighting: November 28, 2021. The theme of Hope was used last year, we will consider and revisit the theme in November. Tammy said that the decorations last year did not stay on the tree. We are thinking of using wire of pipe cleaners to hang the decorations. We will use outdoor red, green, gold and silver ball ornaments. Permanent markers (fine point) can be used to write on the ornaments. There are many Christmas cards left from last year.

Missionary Continued:



Pastor's Report to Council:

Recently, the pastor's discretionary fund was used. A check for \$600.00 was sent out for family or individual in need. Prayers are being answered. God is good.

God IS good. I was blessed to have a great conversation with conference minister Rev. Dr. Bonnie Bates by phone recently. We met by phone first, and then we face timed. Bonnie shared that all pastors in the conference are pulled and pushed. It's a challenging time to pastor with Covid, national pressures, and inhouse strains from every congregations in the no mask/mask wearing quandary. Bonnie did what she always does when we connect. She reminded me that she's there as my pastor. Our time closed in prayer.

I am teaching the teen Sunday school class again. This is exciting, challenging, and fun. Advice I received long ago when I began teaching a Sunday school class is this: you have to grow your own class. Kids won't just come. You have to build your group. Given all the pressures students are experiencing just as teen AND THEN ADD Covid and mandatory quarantines if exposed to the virus, it's tough to be in school these days. Stress levels are high. Depression is high. Anxiety is high.

I've prayed to God on how to grow the class and be present to the students. This lead to a meeting with Dr. Lemoncelli, the MV Jr./Sr. high school principal, and George Barbolish, the Dean of Students. A suggestion was made at the meeting that I could be present to the student population during their lunchtime. Talk about a way to grow a class! Breaking bread together in a high school cafeteria is literally the only way a pastor with a heart for counseling and coaching through God's love can be present to a population of students these days. I would start this at one lunch a week so that my other pastoral visits can continue to be made.

Another pet blessing will take place at its annual time, the first Saturday in November. This year, I'll be in or near the parking lot for pets on Saturday, November 6, from 9-11 AM.

Another new Stewardship Campaign brainstorming event took place recently. As a congregation, the Stewardship Committee and I haven't looked to the denomination's Stewardship Drive material for five or six consecutive years. We've created our own campaign specifically designed to reach our specific congregation. As in years past, I am very impressed with and excited by what was created for the 2021 year. What makes this year unique is that the whole stewardship momentum will encompass the entire service. In years past, we've had "a Stewardship moment" during worship. This year, the sermon series AND the campaign are one in the same.

Speaking of sermon series, I am grateful we did a four-week series on Christian Character. This September series will lead into the Stewardship sermon series that begins October 10th. From Christian Character we will move into the fellowship of believers. Our "Up the creek with out a paddle" will enable us to see what, exactly, it means to be in the same boat (that is, the church) together.

What a joy and honor it was to baptize Braxton Kenneth MacDowall on Sunday, September 12th. A couple of years ago, I married Braxton's mom and dad, Kurt and Tatiana MacDowall. The blessing of being with the couple again and baptizing their little baby boy was a gift from God.

Another joy was being able to attend the "Thank you Summer Lunch Box Volunteers" breakfast on September 18th. Speaking with those I called dignitaries was a pleasure. County Commissioners Betsy Arnold and Alan Hall were there, along with two high school superintendents and a high school principal. I want to share the honor and the reward of being a part of another New Membership Class. We've had such good, lively, Spirit-led conversations around my office table Sunday's following worship. David Schulte, Judy Mitchell and Holli Chichester have joined me. David co-taught the first week. Holli and Judy joined for the second week.

SLB Program honored in Harford

When Paula Smith, the founder of the Summer Lunch Box Program, came to the Harford Church this past summer, she shared from the pulpit many facts about the vital program that feeds so many children and their families who experience food scarcity in the county. In her presentation, Smith casually added how she wanted to honor her dedicated volunteers. This was no hint. It was



just a desire, a plan for "sometime" in the future. That sometime was this past Saturday, September 18th at 9 AM.

The church heard her and offered their Lecture Hall space to accommodate a breakfast the church would host. Smith accepted. Two county commissioners, two local high school superintendents and a high school principal accepted the invitation, too.

In front of an appreciative, attentive audience, Smith thanked all her volunteers. She shared a unique challenge and growth spurt in the program. Her essential volunteers truly stepped up when COVID hit in March of 2020. She said, "The need for food at that time increased dramatically. We fed 102 families in two days."

SLB Program challenges were acute at that time. Bulk food—the staple of the program—was a scarcity. Smith said, "But people just stepped up. We met our challenges. We got the job done." This included \$9,000.00 worth of gift cards that went out to local schools.

Smith was quick to also thank the Hop Bottom UMC and the Hop Bottom Fire Hall, the original hosts for the program. Of those who serve at the Hop Bottom Fire Department, Smith said the dedicated crew was always willing to help. She thanked the local churches that support the program. "They've been there since Day 1. Their donations through the years have helped us add school districts to the program."

This past summer, the SLB Program operated out of the Kingsley Community Church.

Smith thanked that church and the local VFW of Lenox who provide the program's one time a year fundraiser, a chicken barbeque dinner. To date, this fundraiser has cumulatively netted over \$68,000.00 for the cause to make no child hungry in our community.

The SLB Program also thanks the VFW from Montrose. They've hosted a golf tournament for the past two years and have raised over \$17,000.00.

Smith also thanked the Lions Club for helping pick up food. The challenge is getting helpers through the week, and Smith is grateful for the help the club provides. She looks for more help—especially during the week—as the program continues.

Smith and her team hold such heart and compassion for those who experience hunger or empty cabinets during hard times.

Two superintendents also spoke from the heart. Their appreciation for the SLB program was evident and welladdressed. Christopher McComb from MASD said that what makes this area so unique is that small communities stick together. He added that the SLB Program is invaluable to the school's mission because "with proper nutrition, our students come ready and able to learn."

Dr. Mike Elia from MVSD shared McComb's sentiments. "For kids who don't have food—it's tough. Math, English and life lessons are just really tough if a student hasn't eaten. Having this program in the district makes all the difference." Dr. Lemoncelli, the MVSD high school principal, appreciates the mission and the philosophy of the SLB program. "No one goes hungry in our school," he said. "We support each other. The answer is always 'yes' when it comes to supporting programing in the community."

Before the school leadership spoke, the Harford Church organizers contacted the three Susquehanna Commissioners. Commissioner Betsy Arnold said "What impresses me about this area is the awareness that it takes a community—it takes a team. Missions like this start small, persevere, and get the job done." Arnold added, "Thank you to the people like you at the Summer Lunch Box Program who have heart, compassion, vision, love—and energy!"

Commissioner Alan Hall followed Arnold. He echoed her gratitude. "Hats off to the hard work you do. We can send trillions overseas but we can't feed our own kids."

Hall and Arnold are looking into ways the county can fund the SLB Program in the future.

The SLB Program began in 2011 in the Mountain View School District. Smith realized that kids in need weren't getting enough to eat in the summertime when schools and their cafeterias were closed. The program ended that first summer by feeding 69 children at a cost of \$3,881.09.

In 2019, the program added Coconut and needed that summer with 199 children at a cost of \$19, 633.17.

In 2020, the program added ELSD and the rest of the MASD. 550 students were enrolled. The total cost of the program last year was \$47,289.70.

2021 started with 366 students enrolled at a cost of \$16,414.79.

So much financial success comes from so many who add so much, including "Mr. Anonymous" who purchases all the meat in the program. Attorney Giangreco provides his legal services for free.

Smith didn't forget to thank the spouses and families of the volunteers. "Without you there to support and encourage us," she said, "we'd have a much tougher time at this."

Ruthann Batzel, a volunteer, offered a thank you herself just after the meal began. At the table surrounded by her fellow volunteers, she said, "I need this program. I need to get out. I need to serve. This helps me so much."

In all, 46 people attended this "thank you" meal. This included the youth who served the breakfast and 5 very young children. The children are recipients of food from the program. On pick up days, the quintet greets Ruthann and others with appreciation and glee. The children sang a thank you to the SLB Program volunteers to the tune of "Happy Birthday."




