

If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb; If I were a Wise Man, I would do my part; Yet what I can I give Him: give my heart.


— In the Bleak Midwinter, verse 5

Some are glum. Some are gloomy. Some are thinking this Christmas doesn't have to be a Big Deal. Keep it simple. Less is more.

Maybe you're the one who is glum or gloomy. Maybe the thought of this incoming Christmas season has you feeling left out, in the cold, or certainly in the dark.

I mean, *giving* Christmas presents? When is the last time you did *that*? Sure, you may a send a check to your adult children or grandchildren, but giving a real gift—or even the thought of finding something to box and then wrap—

well, that seems overwhelming, or something you did a long, long time ago.



I can answer that. You can, too. Christmas this year isn't found in a box you wrap. Christmas this year is found in the heart. Specifically, it's found in our heart. And you know you shouldn't keep this gift to yourself. Christmas 2023 is like the Sunday school song with these lyrics: it's just like a magic penny. Hold it tight and you won't have any.

If you are glum or gloomy, ask yourself, "What are you holding tightly?" The Christmas of now isn't the Christmas of your yesterday, it's true. I can attest to this.

But does it have to be sad or sullen?

Here comes an excuse. "Ah, Christmas is for kids!"

It's true that tikes like sugar treats and toys—lots of toys. But does this define Christmas? Does this define your Christmas?

Christmas this year isn't like those of the past. But it doesn't mean Christmas has to be less. In fact, it can be the complete opposite. It can be more! The joy in preparing for the coming of the LORD, that is, the season of Advent which will quickly be upon us, is just that—a joy!

I don't think Christmas should be regulated to an image of consumerism we have all purchased without knowing. By this, I think many of us live with guideposts of the past where there is an immediate (and perhaps and extended) family gathering. Big tree. A lot of presents. The dining table extends and a big meal or two or three is shared at high points of the season.

But this isn't all Christmas is. If we think this, we are all cheating Christmas. Maybe it is time to redefine Christmas. Maybe it's time to rethink what else you can give, and get, this Christmas. What you can give and get, is love. It is God's love for you through Christ Emmanuel, and it is your love for Christ that shows in your love for others.

Show love for others. An obvious way to do this is by attending the Christmas tree lighting on Sunday, November 26th from 6 to 7 PM. If the weather or other factors make you think, "Oh, no," then find a ride, or, speaking of presents not wrapped, you can be a ride, you can be the driver, to the church that Sunday evening. The theme this year is *The Tree of Love*.

You know someone who could use a ride that night. Stay in the Lecture Hall for caroling and the tree lighting itself if this is best for you. From the safety of the car, you can always pass the lit tree on your way home.

Christmas doesn't have to be "what you make it." Christmas also doesn't start a bleak midwinter. Christmas is what it has always been, which is the gift of baby Jesus, the Prince of Peace, in your heart.

6 ways to celebrate Christmas:

- 1. Hit the play button. Christmas carols really do work wonders!
- 2. Attend worship each Sunday. When we are sad or sullen, we shut ourselves off from the ones who can care best, and the ones who care best are your church connections (or reconnections).
- 3. Christmas isn't about you. It's about the birth of the Holy One. Recall the October 22nd sermon. As Jesus changed water to wine, He can change you, too.
- 4. Open your eyes and your heart to what is, not to what isn't. Christ is with you. THAT is Christmas!
- 5. Rethink how Christmas can be. Some of what was in your life, now isn't. Enjoy those memories! Be faithful enough to let Jesus direct you to new memories and joys this season of Advent.
- **6.** The Tree of Love really does need you. Come out to the start of Advent with the tree lighting.

THIS MINISTRY OF DOORS MATTERS

Newer technology like Fitbit enables us to know the number of steps we take in a day. I wonder if this app can also tell us the number of doors we go through in a day.

I smile. Maybe the answer is yes!

It makes us think, though. How many doors do we go through in a day?

Since the sermon series on OPEN DOORS began, I am not sure there is a definite answer to the question, especially when we consider the last two sermons in the five-part series. Neither text mentions a door.

Someone who hasn't heard the sermons may wonder, "How can you have a sermon series on doors when the last two texts don't mention a door?"



Good question!

A transition happens in these last two texts. A change occurs. In the story of the Wedding at Cana (our October 22nd text), Jesus changes water to wine. This change is obvious. What isn't obvious is other changes happen as well. While we do not read of this specifically, Jesus' mother changes because of this miracle. The servants who knew the water became wine changed, too.

My point is this. We change when we literally and metaphorically walk through a door. My hope is this. Others will change when they pass through our church doors.

I also hope others who are not close to the church will change when they experience us offering them (and others) the love and outreach Jesus offers. Our Savior calls, inspires and equips us to share not only who He is, but also, how He is. Said simply, we are Jesus' hands and feet. One open door at a time, we can positively impact our neighbors near and far.

Let's continue to do this. Let's be the place of open doors and open hearts. Let's realize by the grace and the glory of God that others have opened doors for us in the past. Others have also been with us, literally beside us, when we've passed through transitions in life that have been way too painful or difficult.

I pray with you that this congregation continues to live out our God-given ministry to draw others to Christ by talking and by doing. Let's feed the poor of heart and spirit. Let's clothe those whose souls need to be welcomed and warmed. Let's gently touch with love those who are lost, grieving, overwhelmed, or are simply having a troublesome day or week. Let's be there with our doors open!

Your participation in this ministry of doors matters. We do not need newer technology to realize our neighbors of all kinds are in need. Let's continue to be a place of both shelter and sanctuary. We can do this with your help, attention, commitment and care.

There are so many ways to participate. Pray with me on where and how God is calling you to be open to the world we can love through the church in Harford He loves.
