

Pastor's Page:

Words we long to hear: "You're okay. You're not in any trouble."

An unexpected guest (a police officer) in an unexpected place (a Christmas tree field) carries an assuring message for us all

Unless I am with my kids who regularly hike with me around the surrounding woods and nearby Christmas tree fields, it is usually just my dogs and me out with what I call God Time. As the pack and I walk through breathtaking nature, our scenes are tranquil. The views are restorative. This connecting time with God is rejuvenating to the spirit.

Until the time the police car follows me into the fields.

Yes, a police car.

"Huh," I think as I turn around and realize an officer of the law has been following me in his police car. "Now this has never happened before."

Let me set this up even more. At this point in what is a loop around the woods and the Christmas tree fields, I am on a road to access harvestable Christmas trees. Farmworkers use this road to get to the fields where they occasionally work. (FYI: Christmas trees do not need 24/7 care.) There is rarely any action or traffic on this road.

So, as desired, I'm in that heavenly zone.

It's the sound of the dogs getting excited behind me that makes me turn back. Immediately, I think this approaching vehicle is a potential Christmas tree buyer. Now and again, a prospective buyer will come to see the growing trees for sale in the fields.

Then I see the police insignia on the driver's side door. The police.

Now I like to hike. This is actually an understatement. I am addicted to moving. Endorphins are my best friends. I don't want to stop and turn around. Yes. It's the police. I realize I should stop and turn around. Wisely, this is what I do. Now, it takes about 40-seconds to get to the police car at the pace that I was doing a moment ago.

As I am walking briskly toward the police car, I suddenly understood why some want to run from the law. I'm thinking, "I can bolt from this!" This is the next thought I have. "You're the pastor of the church 3-miles away. You should not run from the law." All of this is true, by the way.

I get close enough to the car. It has been raining a bit. (This is the Tuesday morning of the Harford Fair). The officer lowers his window. I receive no greeting. The very first thing he says is, "You're not in trouble or anything." Trust me, with that fear of fleeing that I had just had, these are the very words I need to hear in the moment! It turns out the very friendly officer had seen the dogs on the farm road and just wanted to check out the scene.

After we politely parted and I continued on the journey, I thought about the very first thing he said to me. "You're not in trouble. You're okay." As Christians, we want to hear this from God. We long to hear this from God. We dedicate our lives to knowing that we are okay with God. The work we are doing for the Lord out of love and service to Jesus is no burden. It's the opposite. It's delight.

Still, we wonder. *Are* we okay? Is what we're doing all right? Is there something we are missing, doing incorrectly, or blinded to for some selfish reason? Are we okay?

Pastor's Page Continued:

This is why we love scripture. The stories we read of God's people continually have messages for us. They constantly offer guidance at the moments in our lives when guidance isn't optional. It's necessary. Sometimes we learn from their mistakes. Sometimes we receive information and inspiration from their fear to their faithfulness. Their connection to our ever-loving, always wonderful, forever present three-in-one God becomes our connection, too.

As we move into this fall and a thoughtfully homegrown, God-inspired stewardship campaign that I am excited about for us as a church congregation, I want you to think about this: we can approach God like I approached that police car. We don't have to think about running. We don't have to meander, either. We make our way to God at the same good clip that I did that morning. Yes, there may be that flash of fear in our hearts as we come to God. This is the Great I Am, after all. The Maker of the ever-expanding universe has the power. The One who knows you better than you know yourself has the authority.

Yet God, like that police officer, is watching out for us. God is present to us. God doesn't just follow us. God leads us. This is the great news for those who are in the community of believers, which is the theme of the fall stewardship campaign.

As we gather together in the upcoming months as a community of believers, we will hear through scripture what we need to hear from God. "You're okay. I'm just watching you. I'm checking to see that you are safe. I'm making sure you, my beloved ones, are well."

Finance Committee Report:

- *Julia Hudson Trust*-The money of this trust \$16,052.14 is now in a CD. The minimum investment in Equitrust needs to be \$10,000. We will put \$10,000 into a separate Equitrust account 2.5% fixed annuity with Equitrust. The other part of the CD will go into a combined Equitrust fund.
- *Tingley Lake property sale* The \$34,000 from the sale of the land will be taken out of the Capital account and it will be part of the variable Equitrust account.
- The *Memorial fund* has \$25,250.07. \$15,000 will be put in an investment with variable Equitrust group.
- Community Building—there is money in a CD for a community building, \$21,177.85 will be invested in the variable Equitrust account.
- Building Fund Account -- that is currently in the Money Market of \$4,274.78, will be included in the variable Equitrust Fund.
- We will receive statements once a year. The accounts will be shown separately on the statement. We can remove only 10% plus interest once a year on the anniversary date. We can never lose the principal that we invest with Equitrust. The total amount that will be in this new variable Equitrust Fund account will be \$80,504.77.
- The first investment with Equitrust was the Anson and Marie Tiffany building money donation which was \$40,000. This was set up in 2019. As of tonight, it is worth \$46,427.40.
- -Golf Tournament money was placed in the Tech Fund to fund the technical upgrades we are currently enjoying and those in the future.

Willing Workers Minutes: The big group of Willing Workers met on Wednesday, August 4 at 7PM in the Lecture Hall.

Thirteen members were present.

Items discussed:

\$660 paid to Harford Agricultural Society for space, including rent and electricity.

A team of women has transformed the new space in the Carriage Barn into a faux log cabin. It took many hours by a number of women to clean up, fix, and display items. We bought Gibson Methodist Church's remaining knives and display case for \$850. Groups have made Welsh cookies and much fudge.

Storage of knives at the fair was decided on. Purchase of fudge bags and kinds of fudge to sell was also decided. Price of fudge has risen to \$8-a pound, \$4-half pound, \$2-quarter pound.

Yard sale was next on the agenda. It will be held on Friday and Saturday, September 3 & 4. Missionary group and Willing Workers are hosting this event together. Dates were set for sorting and cleaning items. A pulled pork take out lunch with macaroni salad, coleslaw, and a cookie will be available for presale only. Macaroni salad and coleslaw will be purchased. Members will donate cookies. Sign up list is posted for bar cookies.

Friday, Sept 3 will be packaging of lunch items.

Change of date for annual roast beef dinner. It will be April 9, 2022.

Next meeting will be Wednesday, November 3 at 7PM in the Lecture Hall.





Stewardship Meeting Minutes - July 15, 2021

Stewardship met on July 15 at 6:30.

Present were: Nancy Burris, Peg Empet, Julia Gardner, Kay Gow, Shirley Masters, Wendy Phillips.

Topics discussed were the following; Grief support, Maza Fund money, Golf tournament proceeds, Money to be put in new equity fund, HVA Ice Cream Social, and Fall Pledge Campaign.

Shirley thought perhaps the Rt 8l/11 Ministerium might want to talk to those who may be grieving. Nancy brought up the fact that there is a lot of literature online about grief and how to deal with it. Also mentioned that the funeral director at Tuttles/Yeisley is good at working with people who are grieving. We also discussed about maybe having a breakfast for widows and widowers. We also thought perhaps Will could talk to ministers who do grief counselling.

The Maza Fund money is going to be taken out of the CD that it is currently in and put in the money market where it will make more money so the fund will be built back up.

Golf Tournament money was put into Outreach.

June income was \$9,672.22, expenses were \$12,876.42. In the general fund year to date our income is \$64,930.05 while expenses were \$66,828.10 leaving us with a deficit of \$1,898.05.

The following money will be put in a new Equifax account:

\$9,000 from Julia Hudson Trust Fund,

\$34,000 from sale of Tingley Lake property

\$15,000 from Memorial Fund

\$20,500 from a CD

\$3,904.78 from the building fund

This makes a total of \$82,400 to go into the new equity account.

The Ice Cream Social at the HVA is July 16 at 2:00. Peg informed us that there would be two Dairy Ambassadors and one Dairy Maid to serve the ice cream and tell the people what they do in the dairy program. Peg will then let the congregation know how this event went on July 25th.

We next discussed the Fall Pledge Campaign and a suggestion had been given as to the focus of this and it was "Fellowship of Believers". Kay is going to write something up and present it at the next meeting. Peg also is going to talk to Craig and see if he has any other ideas for the campaign.

There will be no meeting in August because of the fair. The next meeting is September 16th at 6:30.
