Treasurer: Julie Gardner. The insurance checks are currently covering the hail damage repairs.

Discussion about the Golf Tournament profits. \$5000 will go into the General Fund and the remainder will be used to help pay for a currently undefined special project or needed piece of equipment. Judy Mitchell and Holli Chichester will research new printing options.

Church Cupboard: Maureen Warren. Currently serving 3 families and 5 individuals.

Clerk: Three deaths and three baptism to date.

Cradle Roll: Holli Chichester. Two blankets and letters were sent to the families of recently baptism children. Letters and books were sent to four children on their birthdays.

Game-On: Weather impacted many of the planned events, but Movie Night and a trip to the park were held. Game-On will resume September 28.

Historian: Attendance for August was as follows: 49, 65, 65, 42

Trustees: Harry Gardner. The carpet has been installed, pew cushions have been ordered, the steeple will be repaired and fiberglass panels may need replaced, damaged screens replaced, bids are being reviewed for the outside painting, the lecture hall needs to be leveled in the future, the gutters and downspouts need to be cleaned out and will be replace in the near future, looking into gutter shields, have signed a contract with Lindsey Oil for oil, checking out propane costs, the roof will be repaired in the future (spring) with 50 year shingles.

Willing Workers: Ellen Holdredge. Served a funeral dinner for the Brainards. Filled and manned the Log Cabin at the fair, all of the fudge and the cookies have been sold, the Roast Beef Dinner will be November 17th, November 7 at 7:00 will be the Willing Worker big group meeting.

-I enjoyed a wonderful meeting with Conference Minister Rev. Dr. Bonnie Bates where we discussed ministry, my doctoral studies, and the future of the church.

-It was such a joy to plan and officiate the August baptisms of Conner Douglas Robert Phelps on August 12th and Sophia Elyse Feduchak on August 19th. Meeting these young parents and helping them baptize their infants to Christ was a beautiful gift to all of us.

-I stood outside the dining hall all day with our kids who took turns with making dog toys from strips of old tee shirts for our ARC (Animal Resource Center). With these toys, we invited passersby to give rather than “get” and with strangers and some familiar faces, I had a very successful day talking about God’s love, church, and care.

-I am working with Craig and Tammy Stout on GAME ON plans for the 2018-2019 school year. Prayers here are welcome!

-I am working with the MVSD to create a prayer service on September 9th and working with Robert Fisher and Kay Gow on a meaningful rededication service in the sanctuary on September 9th. Join us!

-I am working with Kim and Ray Eppley as the couple has decided to renew their wedding vows. The renewal will happen on their wedding anniversary, September 18th.

-Summertime has enabled me to have longer, more casual visits with shut-ins and those I do not see often given my schedule. I continue to visit those hospitalized and appreciate when you, the congregation, share news of those who need a pastoral visit.

Stewardship Minutes

September 20, 2018

Julie Gardner shared the Treasurer's Report noting that the Golf Tournament grossed \$7,000 and what a significant fund raiser it is. Discussion followed as how we all need to be aware and be strongly supportive of this event next year. Stewardship needs to begin planning in February of 2019 as to how we can actively contribute our time and talents to this event. This year the \$3,719 profit from the Fair Dinner was divided between ARC (Animal Rescue Committee) and Youth and Outreach Activities. Julie shared that \$136,960 in insurance money has been received so far, and expenses have been \$79,585 for the hail damage. A new roof, steeple repair, and pew cushions are still to be covered. All in all, the budget looks pretty good. Treasurer's Report approved as presented with a big "thank-you" to Julie for all the work!

Under Old Business, we discussed the theme for the Pledge Campaign. Kay has composed 4 readings that will be used on 4 Sundays in October. There will be a WINDOW from the church involved with a developing theme throughout the month. Members from the Stewardship Committee will do a short presentation on each of the 4 Sundays. The covered dish dinner in October will be sponsored by the Deacons rather than Stewardship. The Calendar of Events will be updated in October, and Kay will make copies of the present one so we can have working copies to edit.

For New Business, Pastor Will shared that there is an "odd" Sunday in the month of November with the way Thanksgiving falls. He suggested that we use that Sunday to focus on a "THANK-YOU" to the congregation for all they have done \$\$\$\$\$\$ this year. With our pledge drive, October will be a month of **WHAT WE NEED**, and November a month of **WHAT YOU'RE DOING**. The need of a new copier was discussed with a price tag of approximately \$5,000. A Neighbors in Need letter was shared, and again, our decision is to have more of a local focus. Another correspondence was from St. Peter's United Church of Christ in Tremont, Pa., asking for some assistance with the event of 3 floods in the last few weeks. Could some OCWM monies be used here? More discussion and advice needed. The final letter was from TREHAB, stating that Susquehanna County was directly affected by the floods and are in need of extra donations for the Feed a Friend program. Craig suggested we set up a donation station for the SUSQUEHANNA COUNTY CHURCHES DESSERT FOOD COLLECTION.

Jo Ann reminded us of the Halloween Party for HVA on October 21 at 1:00 PM. Final plans will be made at the October Stewardship meeting. Meeting was closed with the ENVELOPE STUFFING MARATHON for the Stewardship Pledge Drive.

Trustee Minutes

September 10, 2018

We reviewed and discussed repairs being made on the church. Kandy will contact the insurance adjuster for an update on our expenditures and allowances so that we can get a clearer picture of our budget. We are looking for a painter to do some needed painting on the exterior of the church. We are also looking into having the front corner of the lecture hall lifted so that we can have siding installed on the lecture hall in the future. The sewer pump will need to be moved. An excavator will be hired to dig a new location for the pump installation off to the side of the porch. Work has begun on the steeple. Hopefully, the roof will be completed after completion of the steeple.

Christian Education Minutes

September 2, 2018

The following items were discussed: A teacher at one of the local schools was doing a scholastic project involving providing a new book each month for the students in her class to read and enjoy. Kandy is contacting Mountain View to see if perhaps we could adopt a class to do the same thing. More to come.

September 9, 2018, Sunday school began with a breakfast for the children. They will sharpen pencils to be put in the pew boxes along with the papers that are normally in the boxes.

Fall festival: Children will help set up games and tables for the festival on September 16, 2018. September 23, 2018, the study of "The Bible in a Year" will continue with the book of Psalms.

2.-**CareNet** sent a letter outlining their services to young mothers and fathers. They have a fund-raising banquet on October 11, 2018 at 6:30 at Elk Mountain. Representatives from missionary will attend and give our sponsorship donation of \$100.

3.-**Daily Bread**: they have received our request to reduce the number of Daily Bread's. The Missionary donation was paid by Maureen Warren in September.

Missionary Yard Sale: We will participate in the Christmas in Montrose Celebration this year November 30 – December 2. We will be located at St. Paul's or Lee's Furniture (TBD). We will begin our collection of Yard Sale things now through November 29th. We will separate out Log Cabin Attic Treasure items from the overall donations as much as possible. We will contact Interfaith to determine what their needs are and separate those items also.

Election Day Bake Sale: November 6th. We will contact the Fire Hall to determine if we may hold a Bake Sale on Election Day again. We will ask the congregation to assist us in this endeavor by making announcements and putting up a bake goods sign up sheet. We will also ask for help manning the table.

Disaster Kits: October 1- November 15. The Penn NE Conference and the PA SE Conference suffered massive flooding. Over 1000 clean-up kits and hygiene kits were sent in from the CWS (Church World Service) to our area. We will be collecting items to make both clean-up and hygiene kits to help restock the supply of these for the next disaster.

CWS Hygiene Kit

Supplies needed:

- One hand towel measuring approximately 15"x 28" to 16"x 32"
(no fingertip, bath, dish towel or micro-fiber)
- One washcloth
- One wide-tooth comb removed from the package
- One finger nail or toe nail clipper removed from the package
- One bath size bar of soap in the wrapper
- One toothbrush in the package
- Ten standard size Band-aids

CWS Emergency Cleanup Buckets

Supplies needed:

- One five-gallon bucket with re-sealable lid
- Four scouring pads
- Seven sponges, including one large
- One scrub brush
- Eighteen reusable cleaning towels (e.g. Easy Wipes)
- One 50 oz. or two 25 oz. bottle(s) of liquid laundry detergent
- One 16-28 oz. bottle of liquid disinfectant dish soap
- One 12-16 oz. bottle of household cleaner that can be mixed with water (no spray bottles)
- One package of 48-50 clothespins
- Clothesline, two 50 ft. or one 100 ft.
- Five dust masks
- Two pairs non surgical latex gloves
- One pair work gloves, cotton with leather palm or all leather
- 24-28 heavy duty/contractor type 30-45 gallon trash bags on a roll and removed from carton
- One 6-9 oz. bottle of non-aerosol insect repellent

All cleaning items must be new!!
