

Pastor's Focus on the future, not the troubles today

Stuck. Stymied. Stilted. Sour. These are not words we welcome in our lives, yet we find moments, days, weeks or even seasons where we grapple with difficulties, unfairness, jealousy, envy, family strife, health issues, and the like. These situations are not ours alone; we find these painful dynamics in every story we have shared together this summer in the lectionary passages found in the Book of Genesis. What we have learned from Abraham, Sarah, Hagar, Ishmael, Isaac, Esau, Jacob, Leah and Rebekah is that these faithful yet flawed people present significant character faults and failures. Heart-stopping hardships come as a result of their actions. Rather than finding redemption in their character, which has been challenging to do, we can see again and again the character of God coming through not only in their lives but also in our own lives.

If one recurring theme in Genesis can be shared, it comes through Jacob and Rachel's beloved son, Joseph. While preachers and biblical storytellers elaborate and enhance Joseph's story to draw out his plight; Joseph is, after all, a poster child for things gone wrong—really, *really* wrong. Yet careful examination of Genesis 37 and beyond reveals Joseph never laments his dire circumstances. Instead, he remains faithful to God, a feat difficult for any of us to do with half the adversities Joseph experienced.

How Joseph remained faithful is not his story alone. His story influences and can inspire our own story. Joseph was able to see past all that was in front of him in troublesome times because he literally did see beyond what was in front of him. Joseph dreamed. He didn't just dream though; he dreamt tremendous dreams. His dreams of success in God's abundant blessings were always crystal clear.

Consider our sacred text never shares that among his dreams of success he also dreamt of excessive hardship, disappointment, rejection, betrayal, familial abandonment, slavery, sexual harassment and imprisonment. He only dreamt of a glory-filled future, specifically, his glory-filled future. These dreams sustained him. Similarly, our dreams can sustain us.

In terms of personification, we may not receive from God dreams about bundles of grain bowing down to our own bundle in the field. Equally, suns, moons and stars may not bow to us either, but God's promise of our glorious futures is just as clear and just as perfect as Joseph's. We are Kingdom people who are Kingdom bound. I love the successful 2019 song by Christian artists Sanctus Real, *Nothing can stop an unstoppable God*. Consider the song's title. Do not just imagine a God who takes down your barriers; *trust* this unstoppable God who removes your barriers. Nothing. Stops. God. Nothing. Ever.

Your barriers and blocks are problematic indeed. Mine sure are! They hurt! They cause us to groan and grumble (and this is on a good day). Rather than stay on the course of discomfort, there is a different way to be, a better way to go. We know we can go with God. Whatever hurts our hearts in the now can be given to God who promises us what He showed in dreams to Joseph.

My friend Rhonda, whom I met as an undergrad in our beloved Touring Choir at Grove City College, recently shared a post that we both find a bit too true and amazingly inspiring. It's this. "God is still writing your story. Quit trying to steal the pen. Trust the author." Trust the author.

Any roadblock you have is there for a reason. Maybe it is teaching you humility. Maybe it is teaching you patience. Maybe it is teaching you reliance not in yourself but in your Savior, Jesus Christ. Maybe it is teaching you that every blessing you have in your life is not by your merit but by God's mercy, grace and goodness.

Of course, we want our hardships to disappear. Joseph must have wished this, too. Rather than become bitter, Joseph models for us that we can become better. Joseph shows us that when we lean into God not lament in our circumstances, blessings do come.

Blessings do come.

Let me get back to penning our own story. We cannot choose our own blessings like we can a box of cereal in that long grocery store aisle. We can, however, accept the path we are on, and embrace the place where we are in the moment. And then, like Jesus, whom we follow, we can pick up our mats and walk. Specifically, we can walk forward. When we walk, or as we walk, we can certainly bless others, and this, with a huge return, blesses us. Truly, the last do become first.

I want to close with this. I actually shared this on August 5th for our midweek meditation: The God who knit you together in your mother's womb is the same God who must (or at LEAST from time to time) give you what he gave Joseph, which is the ability to dream and interpret dreams. Big dreams. Bold dreams. Blessed dreams. Your dreams still come, even if you ignore them. Don't ignore them. Follow them.

As we move into the fall season ahead of us, do not fall. Focus on the future, not the troubles today. Follow your God-given dreams. He gave these dreams—these visions—for a reason. As they led Joseph to triumph, they lead us, too.

Here are the lyrics to the Sanctus Real song I mentioned, Nothing can stop an unstoppable God.

First Congregational Church, UCC Trustee Meeting Minutes August 10, 2020

Harry Gardner, Gary Housel, Bill Chichester, and Rick Masters were in attendance.

Old Business:

Shades for the windows in the Sanctuary have been ordered and are being made. They should be delivered this month.

Gary put a new wheel on the wheelbarrow

Harry adjusted the light on the steeple

Gary, Bill, and Harry raked the rocks around the new sign. Shane Lewis is going to install topsoil and seed the area.

Rick has purchased a wireless repeater for the security camera system. Rick and Gary have set a date of 8/14 to complete the project.

Headstones need to be moved from the church entrance. No one can find any information on the headstones near the church entrance. The stones will be removed and placed out of the way behind the lecture hall.

New Business:

Water leaked in all of the new windows on the lecture hall side on the first floor with the heavy rains last week. Harry observed that the top of the windows are not caulked and the wind is blowing the rain in under certain circumstance. Terry Kavetski has offered to come look at the issue next week. If he can't find the issue, trustees will caulk the top of the windows to try to eliminate the issue.

Trustees feel that although council has not approved replacing the blacktop driveway main entrance, that in the least the area around the side entrance of the church should be replaced as it is the most used entrance of the church. The area is unsightly and poses a trip hazard. Trustees will review options and seek bids to complete the project. Harry and Gary will research blacktop and sealing costs. Rick will look at options for concrete.

Gary received the price protection agreement for heating oil from Lindseys. We have \$610 credit left over from last year and the prices will be lower this coming winter. Gary has allotted for 800 gallons for this season. The agreement has been signed and submitted for payment.



Pastor's Report for July 2020

It was an honor to preside over the graveside service for Harford native and peer Larry Herbert. We did this the way Larry would have wanted, which was unconventional, intentional, and motivational. Before the service, the family met in the memorial garden to receive friends and extended family who paid tribute to Larry's life. The service began at noon with the bells from the Spire. Eloquent, hopeful words were spoken about life, death, and eternal life with a Savior who died for us and wants to know us personally and completely.

I am grateful for the contributions I can make weekly through our church Facebook page and our website. These contributions that include the sermon intro, the sermon vlog (which is a 1 to 2 minute video), the midweek meditation and the sermon prep enable us all to walk into the upcoming text each week. Some weeks these contributions are challenging until the Holy Spirit comes and does what the Holy Spirit always does, which is guide His words through me, an empty vessel.

Our Facebook membership continues to grow. Currently, we have 327 members, the last 3 happening just days ago. Now God's work here is impressive! Speaking of the vlogs, a recent vlog had over 250 views. I do not know if all 250 people watched the entire vlog, but this witness and regular, weekly connection in this age is key to the success of God's church here and its future. By this I mean to say that the pandemic will forever change the way people "attend" church. Our outreach is our goal. Saving souls is a must. That we can connect within and around our immediate community is not happenstance. God is guiding us.

Phone calls have been the way to connect with most of you during the pandemic, and I am grateful for our spiritual and our casual conversations. We are learning a lot about each other! I have made visits using safety protocols. Some of these visits have been planned (and please call so we can set up a meeting time and place). Other visits have truly been spur of the moment opportunities to connect by way of God's divine hand.

I have had one visit that will remain extremely private. I cannot and will not share a single detail. I only share this info so that you, too, can contact me at any time *for anything*. What we share together remains confidential, unless you or someone else could be hurt in any way.

As far I know, my graduation from the doctoral program at Lancaster Theological Seminary remains a go for September 5th, the Saturday of Labor Day Weekend. There has been a recent COVID-19 case reported on campus, so I wonder if the ceremony will actually take place. I do long to return to the seminary. It has been over a year since I have been on what I have experienced as hallowed ground.

Some of you may wonder what is next for me. I do not wonder. I trust God. He has lead me to the pastoral position of this, my home church. He will do what He always does—lead! He led me to seminary and the masters degree and later to the doctoral program. We will continue to look to our God for good direction. I do not hear God moving me to a new opportunity. I will do exactly what you are doing, which is serving where I am. And this is joyful! Speaking of joy, I have an update on my foster children. They continue to thrive in their home here. Our caseworker is resigning. In saying goodbye, she shared with candor how I am doing with five children aged 2 to 7. She said, "Grrrreat!" She is truly impressed with how this is going for all of us. Of course, moments are hard. Yes, it's tiring at times. But love? Fun? Lasting memories? Deep connections? Abiding wonder and zeal? We've got this! During the visitation time before Larry Herbert's service, a neighbor, friend and guide said, "People talk, of course. Some think you're crazy for doing this. And there is bad crazy and there is good crazy. You're doing good crazy!" I agree!

Good crazy may be how to look at the months ahead with this pandemic. Keep pressing on, obeying God, and following with both your heart and your mind. We will get through this, and onto the next mission. Our God is good. So are you!

I pray for you, the congregation, and I am grateful for the prayer partnership you extend to me and my new family. God's blessings are upon this church community as we move forward with God's love, grace, mercy, peace, protection, and abundance.

The Quarterly meeting of the Willing Workers was held at 7:00 P.M. in the Lecture Hall. Social Distancing was observed. Kay Gow, President, called the meeting to order. The Minutes were presented. The treasurer's report was presented. It was stated that JoAnn Titus has cashed the outstanding check and the tag on the report should read "Roast Beef Dinner" not "Fair". With a motion by Maureen Warren and seconded by Kandy Wellman the reports were accepted with the correction.

Example: could we forgo rent until we recoup the price of the building, do we have any input as to where on the grounds it would be set, to name a few examples of the questions. This discussion will have to continue.
