

#### I'm not talking leftover turkey: thankful giving isn't just a November thing

It's just like the magic penny, if you remember the Sunday school song. If we hold too tightly to what we think we have in terms of our possessions, we will actually have less.

This may be exactly what Jesus was speaking to when he said to his disciples, "Come follow me." The twelve who would enter a life-changing, faith-building, three-year ministry with Jesus weren't asked to fill the cart Jesus was pushing with their carry-on luggage. Instead, Jesus invited them into what could be called a 'manna and quail' life of thankful living that would become thankful giving.

We receive heavenly manna and quail each day. Of course, I'm not being literal with what God's people received during their wilderness journey, but you know this is true: each day we do receive gifts from God. When we intentionally practice lives of thankful living that includes our awareness and our celebration of our receiving manna and quail, we turn to giving. Specifically, we turn to thankful giving.

The difference between giving and thankful giving is in how the giving is, well, given! I mentioned one Sunday school song a moment ago, *The Magic Penny*. Now think about the hymn, *Count Your Blessings*. When we begin to count the blessings we have, we have an attitude shift. We operate not out of a fear of not enough. We overflow in the faith of our God who is always providing more than enough.

Admit your prayer life is like mine. It regularly includes being thankful to God (or should regularly include thankfulness to God). But how about our prayers for thankful giving? With whatever God is calling you to give (and, like the disciples mentioned, God is calling you to follow Him and give), I invite you to think not just about giving, but pray for a life of thankful giving.

Thankful giving is completely joy-based. Thankful giving is also abundance-based. The story of Moses, manna and quail and the 40-year journey may be specific to only a certain part of our collective journey with God through barren places. But think of this. What was true then also holds true today: every gift we have is not ours. Every gift we have is given by God.

Share this!

I usually write the pastor's page from the familiar surrounds of my writing desk at home on a computer screen that I have matter-of-factly been told is too big. I love that space. I love that computer.

This page is written from an entirely different location. As I type on my laptop, I want to share that I am at 34,000 feet above the breadbasket of America. Here on this big, smooth riding airplane, all my fellow passengers and the flight crew are wearing mandatory face masks. Seated so closely, I see a cross section of who we are really. All of us. Affluent. Stingy. Open. Closed. Friendly. Distant.

As I am surrounded by an entirely different set of people, I realize all of us could be doing more thankful living. This thankful living leads to more thankful giving. How do we more thankfully give? We follow Jesus. For example, when the Lord said, "Let the children come to me," this is just what he meant. Let them come!

Come to what? I invite you to consider this. What, exactly, are we living? What are we giving? Is it a hollow invite or is it a place and space of consideration, connection and camaraderie?

Like Jesus, we have something to give because, at the core, we are a people who give. This is who we are. This is what we are. Being givers of faith, hope, love, and care is not a goal, it's an identity. Specifically, it is our identity.

Here is my post-Thanksgiving challenge. Let the season of thankful giving continue into December and the New Year. Send that compliment. Shoot that praise to someone you know well or have recently met. Celebrate that accolade with the one you're thinking of and admire. Share that smile. Hum that song that will make others smile. Open your wallet wisely, yes, and open your wallet more when you know God is asking you to do so. High-five that kiddo. Whistle. Laugh. Lighten up. Listen through your soul which you know still has that child in you.

Here's the truth. Thankful living in God's abundance easily leads us to thankful giving. Give thankfully.

#### The "Wows" of Christmas

You could describe my seven-year-old as giddy, gleeful, and *grand* about the idea of Christmas. She asks as I hold a wad of Christmas tree lights in front of our freshly-cut tree standing majestically in the house. "It's Christmas time, right?"

"Um," I answer.

It's November 26<sup>th</sup>. The tangle in my hands is taking some thought, especially since this string is already connected to what I've already placed on the tree.



She pauses. Unsatisfied with what she has just heard, she asks again. "It's Christmas time, right?"

My girl raises a good question. It is Christmas time, right?

Advent is the time we prepare for Christmas, just as we were doing with the tree. You can see how my fellow decorator—overwhelmed by the scent of the spruce and the aura of the lights—could ask what she asked.

When my soon-to-be nine-year-old helped us a few minutes later, I won't forget the sound he made with the word, "Wow." He had just brought me yet another string of lights. This one was on a spool. He plugged this in for me and the sudden shock of golden light cradled in my arms made me think of what the shepherds might have said when they first laid their eyes on Jesus.

Yes. "Wow."

Before the birth of Christ, people were waiting for the light of the world. The prophets' predictions about a Savior on earth were just words. Remember, four-hundred years lapsed between Micah, the last book in the Old Testament, and the first book in the New Testament, the Gospel of Matthew. Having this Chosen One from God actually being here on the planet seemed implausible, if not all-out impossible. So many must have considered these long-ago words to be outrageous fiction.

But these words are not a far-off dream. God came as a newborn who would die on a cross to save us from the sins we create and cannot escape from.

This is the biggest "Wow" of all time.

Three minutes after my son said, "Wow," he did a doozy to his sister, the Christmas cheerleader. Convicted by what he had done, he cried.

With his tears, I shared that we can never get out of the doozies we have done, the sins that convict us. Only Jesus can do this.

This release from sin is Christmas. And this is not seasonal, this is every day.

The biggest "Wow" of all time is that Christmas never leaves us. It is always here. Christ saving us from our sins is ongoing.

Enjoy the "Wows" of Christmas through Advent. Like the ancient predictions from the prophets of long ago, the trees and the lights and the gift-giving are not outrageous. They are celebrations of a God who sets us free from our sinful selves.










#### **Reilly Potter**

#### People, stick with the paddles up the creek

Black Friday isn't enough. Now there's "GivingTuesday".



You may be on to this, but I just learned about Giving Tuesday for the first time. I read of this day in the HOLIDAY LIVING 2021, an Advertising Supplement to *The Independent*. There on page 10, across from my column in this edition, is the headline that reads, "How to participate in GivingTuesday (no space between the two words), a one-day event of giving at the front end of the retail blitz season upon us now. Giving Tuesday happens on the first Tuesday following Thanksgiving. According to the article, "GivingTuesday is a movement that unleashes the power of radical generosity around the world. GivingTuesday is often characterized as hashtag activitism..."

The radical generosity that we Christians know and share isn't a day of the year. It's every day of every year. Why? Because Christ dying on the cross for our sins and our eternal salvation is the *ultimate* meaning of radical generosity.

GivingTuesday is another sign of the secular world we live in today. With less and less church, there are more and more non-Christian efforts housed well in humanitarianism. As more and more churches close for good, the basic need for people to care goes elsewhere.

We are seeing a hurting, struggling world. We are seeing the lost, the lonely and the broken perhaps in ways we've never seen before. Sure, one-day charitable events like GivingTuesday are far, far better than no charitable events at all, but I invite you to remember the fall stewardship sermon series, *Going Up the Creek With a Paddle*.

That homespun series began this past June in my office. A group of us looked at all the hurt and hardship in the world and wanted to speak to this. Ideas for the stewardship sermon series began, culminating with the October series that included a new word each week on the authentic paddle in the sanctuary. The words we learned from and lived into are:

Compassion Wisdom Commitment Christ Courage

We need all of these words far more than we need a special one-day commercial campaign. These words help us get up our own creeks. Equally, they help us help others get up their own creeks, too. They draw us not to ourselves and our merits. They lead us to Christ and the Christian response to those around us in need.

The stewardship series helps us do far more throughout the year. As an organization of love and care—as a church that does things—the series draws us to the opportunities we have to give and give well. We want to help. We want to be present. We want to be used by Christ in gentle, subtle ways as individuals and intentional, significant ways as a church.

Consider how God is gifting you as you read this. Our Lord has given you hands and a heart for use. When you think of giving on a Tuesday, for example, what, exactly, does that look like? How can the church meet your goal, your dream, and your passion? Gifting the church enables others to be gifted. The Stewardship series hasn't ended. Opportunities to pledge, volunteer, motivate wellness and activate joy happen each day of the week, each month of the year, and every year. Together, let's help others through rough waters. See me or a stewardship member to discuss where God is calling you. We are here to listen to you because, with Christ, we are all here to care.

#### A LETTER FROM YOUR PASTOR ABOUT A WONDERFUL OPPORTUNITY TO GIVE

As I was reviewing our current financial situation, I realized that I was facing a wonderful opportunity. I have the opportunity to lead by example. I have decided to forego my annual raise this year in light of the beautiful situation we are experiencing with our finances. This is a beautiful situation. You may immediately think of this with such words—beautiful, really?—but God is calling us to Him in a way He has not before. God is asking us to let Him bless the gifts we have, not keep our gifts to ourselves.

This is an amazing challenge for me personally. It can make my stomach rumble and my teeth chatter. I have five mouths to feed! The cost of living is not going down! But I trust God and lean on God to guide us through this situation that will turn out in His favor and ours.

I see God using this time as an opportunity for us to see who we really are. Do we really mean what we say? Do we care, or do we superficially care?

I know the answer to those two questions. You do, too. We do mean what we say. We do care tremendously. We are not just a church that is open. We are church that is open and invested in ongoing community outreach and care. Said differently, we are not in this for ourselves. We are in this to share the love of Christ to others in word and in action.

These lean times mean we lean in even further and see the blessings and the bounty God does provide.

God wants us to give our treasures so that He can bless these gifts. Thinking that "someone else will do it" when it comes to our resources is not what we are called to do. Looking at the budget and adding our proverbial two cents isn't the way to go, either. I'm not saying we should not have a voice in the budget. Speak up. Speak out. What I am saying is to honor the decisions our church council has set for the future of this congregation.

I realize I have to earn my keep. I will do so.

In September 2022, I enter my fourteenth year as your pastor. This will make me the third longest standing pastor in this church's history. This is significant. In my fifty-five years of life, and as a member of this church since I was fourteen, no pastor has had this standing. I have a spiritual, emotional and familial investment. I care and I love this church and its people.

Remember, I am the seventh generation on this land. You can date my family back to John Carpenter, one of the Nine Partners. I'm not renting space at the pulpit waiting for a better deal now that I hold a doctorate. I'm a landowner, a homeowner here in Harford. "You are in this for the long race," the Apostle Paul would say to me if he could.

We are going to get through this remarkably well. You'll see. As I write this on November 30, 2021, I have learned that our pledges are coming in. We have to honor those pledges and hear God speak to us as other gifts come in. Our lean, tight ministry outreach programs run efficiently and effectively. We care what we do. We do what we will say we will do. We love our God. Our God loves us. Even more great opportunities to witness and live Jesus's love are just around the corner.

I repeat. This is a beautiful situation. See it as I do. Respond to it with heart, prayer and a commitment to the church of today and tomorrow.



# **Bible Study**


Meeting the Spirit — Bible Study

Dear Members of Council.

This communication shall serve as an update to the status of the bell choir.

When the bell choir ceased rehearsing because of COVID-19, we had a strong core group that filled out two octaves. Since then, we have lost one member who is no longer with the church and two other members are unable to make a firm commitment. I have secured one replacement ringer and have interest from one ringer who unfortunately cannot rehearse on Monday evenings. I am talking with possible ringers from other churches but at this time we do not have a full roster. I've been told that existing members of the bell choir are recruiting, but no one has been in touch with me about that.

Naturally, this is discouraging to me as the director, but it is my hope to begin rehearsing soon with one or more "substitute" ringers from other churches in the hope that we'll be able to perform Christmas music. That would enable us to ring two octaves with four vacancies remaining in the third octave.

It goes without saying that additional ringers are always welcome.
